### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance approves the reprogramming of funds in the amount of \$45,215 from the FY 2002-03 Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) budget. The San Antonio Metropolitan Ministry (SAMM), funded by ESG, is requesting an amendment to their award to SAMM Dwyer Avenue Center Overflow Shelter from \$92,500 to \$47,286 and adjusting the budget for the SAMM Shelter on Commerce Street from \$40,000 to \$85,214.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

On May 23, 2002, City Council accepted an award of \$715,000 in Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) funds from the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD). As a result of the Request for Proposal (RFP) process, the Department of Community Initiatives, Community Action Division recommended funding to the SAMM Dwyer Overflow Shelter in the amount of \$92,500 for operation of this facility. Through this same process it was also recommended and approved by Council to award \$40,000 to the SAMM facility on Commerce Street to assist with operation of this facility.

SAMM is now requesting an adjustment to these allocations. Federal regulations limit the amount of salaries which can be charged to this grant for staff working specifically in the operation of a facility. Due to this limit, SAMM does not believe they would be able to expend all funds allocated to the Dwyer site based on the original award. This requested change in shelter allocation will allow for the payment of more allowable expenses SAMM incurs at the Commerce facility.

## **POLICY ANALYSIS**

This is a continuation of existing City policy to provide services to the homeless in San Antonio & Bexar County.

The number of people to be served at both facilities will remain constant. Due to the limitation on the number of beds provided, the increase in the award to SAMM on Commerce facility will not result in an increased number of clients served. SAMM anticipates they will serve approximately 2,136 unduplicated clients at this facility annually. Likewise, the decrease in funding to SAMM Overflow shelter will not impact the number clients served and will be off-set by other funds already identified by SAMM. The Overflow shelter serves approximately 539 unduplicated clients annually.

# **FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no General Fund commitment.

#### **COORDINATION**

Coordination has occurred with the City Attorney's Office, Office of Management & Budget, Finance Department, Asset Management and the Department of Housing & Community Development.
