SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends a professional service contract in the amount of \$21,175.00 payable to Civil Engineering Consultants, a non-MBE firm, in connection with the Glider & Landing-Gunsmoke to Loop 410, an authorized Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funded project, located in Council District 6.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance will provide additional compensation to Civil Engineering Consultants for administrative services during the construction phase of this project. The Glider & Landing-Gunsmoke to Loop 410 project provides for the reconstruction of Glider and Landing from Gunsmoke to Loop 410, Altitude from Landing north to cul-de-sac to a 30-foot width, and parkway improvements such as new curbs, sidewalks, and driveway approaches. This project also includes the reconstruction of the drainage channel from Altitude to Observation.

This professional services contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 87782 on May 14, 1998 and initially authorized \$40,487.00 for services related to this project. Subsequent City Council action authorized additional funds for this project in the total amount of \$18,338.00, and brought the total contract value to \$58,825.00. This City Council action will increase the contract to an overall total of \$80,000.00.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to construct previously approved CDBG funded Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure. The project will be funded in the amount of \$21,175.00 from CDBG funds and authorized payable to Civil Engineering Consultants.

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget, the Finance Department, and the Housing and Community Development Department.


