Dear Ms. Connor:

Thank you for your interest in our Young People's Concerts. I am sending your request form for contingency funds and a copy of our Ethics Disclosure forms for the current funding cycle.

The Symphony has been presenting these concerts since 1945, and we believe they are a valuable component of the students' education. The Young People's Concert (YPC) series comprises four different concert programs, each offered six times at Trinity University's Laurie Auditorium to elementary-aged students from schools all over San Antonio. The program is managed by the Symphony's Education Director and is coordinated with the *Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills* (TEKS). A *Teacher's Guide* is written and mailed to subscribing schools.

The purposes of the YPCs are to educate students about symphonic music, to provide exposure to the art of live performance, and encourage their participation in music education, which enhances learning in other academic areas. Research recently released by Arts Education Partnership, and reported on the NEA website (http://arts.endow.gov/endownews/news02/news1.html), demonstrates that the arts are linked to student development and have a particularly positive impact on economically disadvantaged students and students with learning disabilities. YPCs target fourth- and fifth-grade students, a critical time for encouraging participation in school band and orchestra programs, usually begun in middle school.

Ticket prices are kept low (\$5.00 for Season tickets and \$2.00 for a single-presentation ticket) to allow all students to attend. In addition, schools that receive Federal Title I assistance are offered Season tickets at half price. Ticket revenue is less than 20% of the expense associated with producing these concerts. Because we are committed to our Education Program, we must raise the funds to continue this program every year.
