SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends the contract with RCC Consultants, Inc. for continued on-site project management and consulting services to the City Of San Antonio and Bexar County for the construction and implementation of the 800 MHZ Public Safety Radio System in an amount not to exceed \$568,500.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City Council authorized city staff to work with Bexar County in developing a new Public Safety Radio System to replace the current system. In July 1996, Council authorized the selection of RCC Consultants to assist the City and County in the development of specifications, a request for proposal, evaluation criteria for vendor selection and evaluation of the proposals. In May 1999, Council authorized staff to negotiate a contract with Ericsson, Inc. to purchase and install a new 800 MHZ Trunked County-wide Radio System. In August 1999, Council approved the contract with Ericsson, Inc. and also approved a professional services contract with RCC consultants, Inc. for project management and technical assistance during the construction, installation and implementation of the system.

The Radio Project Team has completed the initial construction and installation of the infrastructure including tower site acquisitions, tower construction, antenna installations, shelters and installation of the electronics, backup generators, test consoles and fiber optic cable linking all tower sites and dispatch centers for Police, Fire, EMS, Airport and Bexar County Sheriff. Software loading and configurations were completed and system optimization was performed to commence the radio coverage testing process. Over the past several months five teams, including staff from Police, Fire, EMS, Sheriff, ITSD, Consultants and the Vendor, have performed signal measurement testing and audio

quality testing for over 1200 sq miles. The data captured during these tests has been analyzed by the team resulting in recommended enhancements and configuration changes required to successfully pass the radio coverage acceptance testing process. These improvements are currently underway by the Vendor and testing will resume shortly to re-test the areas impacted by the improvements to verify compliance with coverage requirements. It is anticipated that these activities will be completed by December of this year and formal cutover will commence in the first quarter of next year.

The continuance of the contract with RCC Consultants is required to provide on-site project management and resources to facilitate coverage testing, system acceptance, system cutover, punch list resolution and project closure to ensure that all project goals are met and that formal acceptance of the system will be accomplished successfully.

POLICTY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of Council policy previously approved by Council through ordinance 90320.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated total expenditures will not exceed \$568,500. Funding for this contract is budgeted and authorized in the Public Safety Radio System Phase III Project Fund including Contributions from Bexar County.

COORDINATION

This Item has been coordinated with the City Attorney's Office, Police, Fire and Bexar County.

Indirect contributions by an entity include, but are not limited to, contributions made through the officers, owners, attorneys, or registered lobbyists of the entity.
