SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes Community Development Block Grant funds in the amount of \$17.687.60 payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio as escrow agent for Miguel Segovia a/k/a Mike Segovia, and wife, Gloria C. Segovia for Fee Simple Title (\$9,100.00), and a Right of Entry Agreement (\$100.00); and Joel Pedroza Talingo and wife, Adriana Pedroza for Fee Simple Title (\$7,387.60), and a Right of Entry Agreement (\$100.00); and related title charges (\$1,000.00) for a total sum of \$17,687.60 in connection with the Emmett St: Block #500 to Block #700 (Deadend to Deadend) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Project located in Council District 3.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

There are two parcels to be acquired in this project, which is scheduled to let for contract in January 2003. This project is scheduled to start construction in May 2003 and completed by November 2003. The scope of this project provides for a typical 30-foot wide, 2-lane street section, and necessary drainage. This project will also reconstruct Emmett from deadend to deadend and includes sidewalks, curbs, and driveway approaches.

POLICY ANALYSIS

The acquisition of this property is necessary for the completion of the project.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funds in the amount of \$17,687.60 are available from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and authorized payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio.


