REPROGRAMMING OF \$111,003.08 IN HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES

FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS (HOPWA) FUNDS

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance approves the reprogramming of \$111,003.08 from the FY 2000 Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) grant. The reprogramming of funds will award \$111,003.08 to the San Antonio AIDS Foundation (SAAF) for the purpose of providing Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) to individuals who have HIV/AIDS and their family members.

Staff recommends that this ordinance be approved.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

HOPWA is an entitlement grant from the U. S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD). In 2000, the City of San Antonio received an award of \$823,000. City Council approved allocations to the Alamo Area Resource Center (AARC) in the amount of \$113,310 and to the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (SAMHD) in the amount of \$64,352. AARC expended \$66,658.92 leaving a balance of \$46,651.08. The SAMHD did not expend any of their HOPWA award.

Subsequently, an RFP was issued in October 2001, and advertised in the San Antonio Express-News for the purpose of providing TBRA to Persons with AIDS. No proposals were submitted. Another RFP was issued in July 2002, and advertised in the San Antonio Express-News and La Prensa, for the same purpose. The SAAF was the only respondent to the RFP and will serve approximately 41 unduplicated households with this additional funding.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This ordinance will continue existing City policy to provide needed services to low-income residents of the San Antonio Eligible Metropolitan Statistical Area. This includes the counties of Bexar, Comal, Guadalupe and Wilson.

FISCAL IMPACT

This ordinance authorizes the re-programming of \$111,003.08 in HOPWA funds to the San Antonio AIDS Foundation. There is no General Fund commitment.

COORDINATION

Coordination has occurred with the City Attorney's Office and the Department of Housing & Community Development, Finance Department, Office of Management & Budget, Asset Management Department and the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District.
