SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance ratifies services and appropriates funds in the total amount of \$1,881.00 for Invoice No. 31992 (\$1,540.00), Invoice No. 32031 (\$75.00), and Invoice No. 32065 (\$266.00), payable to Chemron, Inc., a non-MBE firm, for environmental laboratory services in connection with the Salado Creek Phase I (Hike and Bike) project, an authorized 1999 General Obligation Bond funded project, located in Council District 2.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance will provide compensation to Chemron, Inc., for engineering services related to the Salado Creek – Phase I (Hike and Bike) project. Due to an area of concern identified within the project limits, the Environmental Services Department conducted soil sampling along the proposed Salado Creek hike & bike trails to determine if the subsurface soils have been impacted by potential contaminants. Soil samples were analyzed by Chemron under an existing Purchasing Contract. Results from this sampling event identified impacted soils within the project limits.

The Salado Creek Phase I (Hike and Bike) project includes the design for a hike and bike trail along Salado Creek from Willow Springs Golf Course to Comanche Park. This phase of the project is currently under design. The current estimated project construction cost for this phase of the project is \$2,700,000.00.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to construct previously approved 1999 General Obligation Flood Control with Park Improvements Bond funded Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure. The project will be funded in the amount of \$1,881.00 from 1999 General Obligation Flood Control with Park Improvements Bond funds and authorized payable to Chemron, Inc.

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.

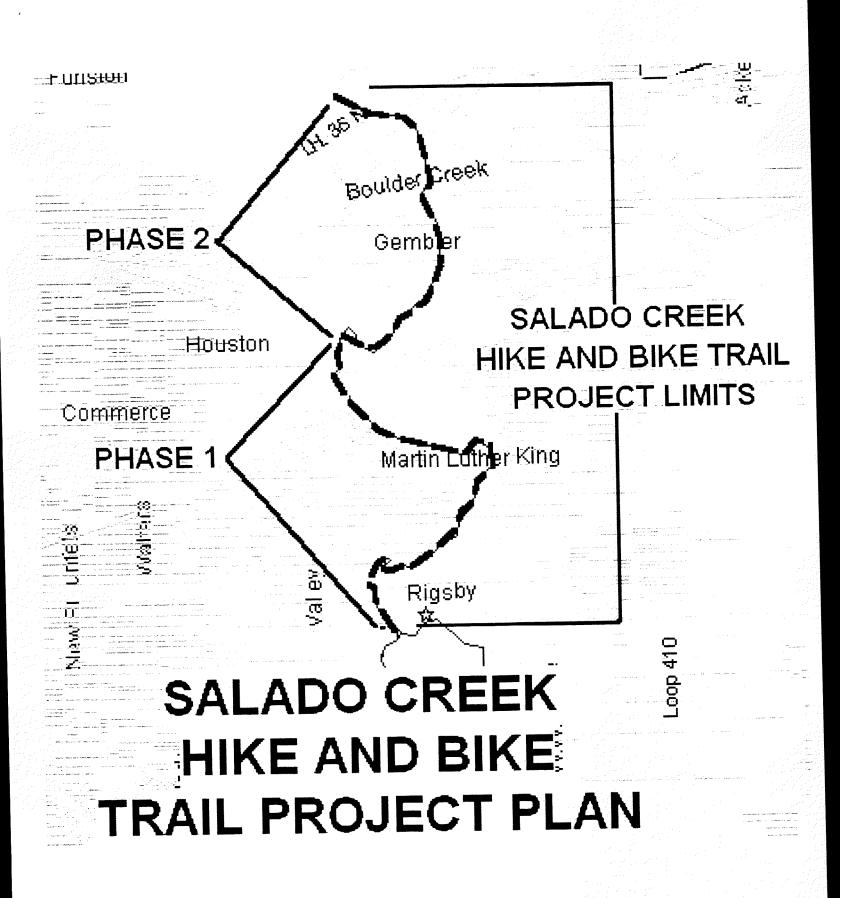
