SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends a professional service contract and authorizes additional funds in the amount of \$69,900.00 payable to Hoyt Consulting Engineers, Inc., a non-MBE firm, and miscellaneous engineering contingency in connection \$6,990.00 for Flores/Breeden/Beacon Drainage Outfall Phase II & El Monte from Flores to San Pedro project. This is an authorized 1999 General Obligation (G. O.) Street Improvement Bond funded project located in City Council District 1.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The original scope for Flores/Breeden/Beacon Outfall was revised for the purpose of extending the project scope to include El Monte from Flores to San Pedro. By concurrently designing both projects, the project was bid as one, saving time, advertising costs, and receiving more cost effective bids. The El Monte from Flores to San Pedro part of this project has since been divided into three phases. Phase I will provide for the reconstruction of the intersection of N. Flores at El Monte & El Monte from N. Flores to San Pedro, including curbs, sidewalks, wheelchair ramps, driveway approaches and drainage system. The streets will be designed for 2 lanes and 4-foot sidewalks against the curb. Phase II of this project will provide for the reconstruction of N. Flores from El Monte to La Manda to 2 lanes, including concrete curbs, 4 ft. sidewalks, wheelchair ramps, driveway approaches, and drainage improvements. Phase III will include the reconstruction of El Monte from Blanco to N. Flores to include curbs, sidewalks, wheelchair ramps, driveway approaches and necessary drainage. This street will be designed to 2 lanes, including 4-foot wide sidewalks against the curb.

This ordinance will bring the El Monte - Blanco to San Pedro Phase I plans through the Final Design phase and will bring the El Monte - Blanco to San Pedro Phase III plans through Phase B, which is the detailed design phase.

This professional services contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 91422 on March 16, 2000 and initially authorized \$161,200.00 for the original scope of services related to this project. Subsequent City Council action authorized additional funds for this project in the total amount of \$32,510.00 and brought the total contract value to \$193,710.00. This Council action will increase the total, to date, authorized for this professional service contract to \$263,610.00.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to construct previously approved 1999 G.O. Obligation Street Improvement Bond funded Capital Improvement projects.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funds in the amount of \$76,890.00 are available from the 1999 G.O. Street Improvement Bond funds and authorized as follows:

\$69,900.00 payable to Hoyt Consulting Engineers, Inc., for engineering services

\$ 6,990.00 payable for engineering contingency

COORDINATION

This request for Ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.


