SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

A. This ordinance accepts the proposal and authorizes the City Manager or her designee to execute a one-year contract in the approximate amount of \$510,340.00, based on unit prices, with BFI Waste Services of Texas, L.P. to provide solid waste collection, disposal and recycling services in the IH 10 East area for the period of January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2003, and authorizes up to three (3) additional one (1) year extensions upon the approval of the Director of Environmental Services.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

B. This ordinance accepts the proposal and authorizes the City Manager or her designee to execute a one-year contract in the approximate amount of \$224,640.00, based on unit prices, with Waste Management of Texas, Inc. to provide solid waste collection, disposal and recycling services in the IH 10 West area for the period of January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2003, and authorizes up to three (3) additional one (1) year extensions upon the approval of the Director of Environmental Services.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

C. This ordinance accepts the proposal and authorizes the City Manager or her designee to execute a one-year contract in the approximate amount of \$462,777.00, based on unit prices, with Waste Management of Texas, Inc. to provide solid waste collection, disposal and recycling services in the Timber Ridge area for the period of January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2003, and authorizes up to three (3) additional one (1) year extensions upon the approval of the Director of Environmental Services.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The City of San Antonio began using contract services for solid waste collection in the late 1980's as a result of annexations. Contracting solid waste services in certain areas has historically provided an efficient and flexible means of managing the overall solid waste program.

There are a total of seven (7) contracts providing residential solid waste collection, disposal and recycling services. The contracts also provide for brush collection, dead animal collection, neighborhood cleanups and other related services. The collection services provided by contracts must be identical to those provided by City forces. A total of 26,116 homes, or 9% of City residences, are served by either BFI Waste Services of Texas or Waste Management of Texas through City contracts for solid waste collection. The contracts are for a one-year period with three one-year optional extensions. Currently, the monthly contractual rates range from \$7.68 to \$8.93 per household for basic collection and disposal.

The City also provides many other operational services to the customers in the contract areas to include customer billing and collections, quarterly audits, monitoring for compliance and processing the contractor payments. The City provides the customer service component through 311, so that customers can express concerns or ask questions regarding service delivery. Code compliance enforcement, staff support for neighborhood meetings, and promotional and educational materials are also provided by the City to customers in these contract areas. In addition, residential customers have access to the City's Household Hazardous Waste and the Bitters Brush Recycling facilities, free landfill days and other special clean-up events.

The IH-10 East area, is currently serviced by BFI Waste Services of Texas and the IH-10 West and Timber Ridge areas are serviced by Waste Management of Texas. The areas in each of these three contracts have been expanded in order to improve efficiency and to maintain continuity. The criteria used for determining if contracts need to be expanded includes annexation and infill growth, cost analysis and maintenance of the workload standard for the collection crews. Currently, there are a total of 6,048 units served under the existing contracts. These three existing Solid Waste contracts, including renewal options, expire on December 31, 2002.

The proposed contracts would expand the service area in each of the three areas and bring the total units served to 12,038 units. The following chart illustrates the growth in the number of units served by the proposed contracts:

The City solicited separate proposals for these areas on October 18, 2002, once service levels were established. Factors used to evaluate and select the collection contractors include cost of services, financial and operational capability of the company, recycling program, staff experience, subcontractors, demonstrated participation in and support of community clean-up activities, local and disadvantaged business participation, and Small Business Economic Development Advocacy Policy compliance. The scoring matrix for the proposals that were received is attached.

Two (2) solid waste collection companies submitted proposals for each of the areas. The monthly proposed rates, which are direct costs to the City, were submitted as follows:

Area	BFI monthly proposed rate	WM monthly proposed rate
IH-10 East	\$7.71 per household	\$9.88 per household
IH-10 West	\$10.57 per household	\$9.75 per household
Timber Ridge	\$10.45 per household	\$8.38 per household

Based on the initial evaluation of the proposals, City staff recommended accepting the proposal from BFI for the IH10 East area since the monthly proposed rate is within an acceptable range. However, the monthly proposed rates that were submitted by Waste Management for the Timber Ridge and IH 10 West areas are higher than projected in the FY 2003 budget.

In response to these significantly higher costs, and working closely with the Office of Management and Budget and the Purchasing and General Services Department, staff conducted a thorough analysis of the fiscal and operational impacts of providing City force solid waste services to the 12,038 homes in the three areas. Although the current citywide average direct cost for city forces to provide the solid waste collection services is \$8.64, staff analyzed the actual collection costs for these specific areas.

The City's actual monthly collection costs for each of these contract areas was compared to the proposed monthly rate from BFI for the IH 10 East area and the proposed rate from Waste Management for the Timber Ridge and IH 10 West areas. The analysis concluded that the City's costs are higher because in order to add these homes using existing personnel and equipment a Wednesday/Saturday schedule would need to be implemented, adding collection routes for garbage, recycling and brush. This would result in higher costs related to overtime, equipment maintenance and disposal costs.

By evaluating actual costs for collection routes in these three areas, it has been determined that providing the collection service by City forces to these 12,038 homes during FY 2003 (January 1, 2003 through September 30, 2003) would result in an increased cost to the Environmental Services Fund of approximately \$550,893. By accepting the three proposals, the increase costs to the Fund would be \$347,719 – a difference and savings of \$203,174.

The Environmental Services Department staff recommends moving forward with these solid waste contracts for FY 2003. City staff will continue to analyze contract prices, as well as the City's costs to provide these services. As other contracts approach expiration in the near future, the impacts to the Environmental Services Fund will be evaluated. In order to be prepared to add homes to the City's service program in the future, resources will need to be included in future budgets and alternative collection methods will need to be explored.

POLICY ANALYSIS:

When these areas were originally annexed, the City opted to request proposals for solid waste services. This plan met the expectations of the impacted residents and allowed the City to evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of using private collection companies. These ordinances continue the City Council's direction to use private sector firms to enhance the City's efficiency and compliance with regulations.

The term of these contracts is January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003. The contracts are for one-year with options for three one-year renewals. The renewal terms are subject to the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The adjustment for the CPI may not vary more than five percent (5%) from the current base compensation amount for each respective term year. By authorizing these contracts on an annual basis, staff is able to continuously analyze the contract costs for service against City costs and make adjustments to ensure that the most efficient collection methods are in place.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Revenues of \$12.21 per month per residence are generated from Solid Waste, Environmental and Brush fees in affected areas and will be the source of funding for the contracts. It is estimated that during the initial twelve-month term of the agreement, \$1,763,807 will be generated in revenues based on 12,038 homes, the number of residential ratepayers in these three areas. The revenues are budgeted in the Environmental Services Revenue Fund and are based on the actual fee that is collected from each customer for all of the services that are provided.

The estimated City expense, payable to BFI Waste Services of Texas, L.P. and Waste Management of Texas, Inc., is \$1,197,757 for the direct costs associated with garbage, recycling, brush and dead animal collection as well as the related disposal costs. These funds shall be paid monthly in accordance with the contract terms.

The difference of approximately \$566,000 are those revenues that provide for the City's contract administration costs and additional environmental services programs such as household hazardous waste collection and disposal, Bitters Brush Recycling operations, citywide clean-up events, neighborhood education programs, customer service, and code enforcement.

COORDINATION:

This Ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget, the Purchasing and General Services, Economic Development, and Asset Management Departments and the City Attorney's Office.

SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS:

Requests for Proposals are issued for residential collection services because the nature of the operation requires various kinds of equipment, varying levels of workforce expertise, and direct contact with the customers. Many factors, other than just the cost must be considered during the evaluation process with extensive focus on the proposer's experience and capacity to provide all of the services required.

In addition, due to health and safety reasons, contracts for collection and disposal of solid waste are not restricted to competitive bidding statutes.
