Indirect contributions by an individual include, but are not limited to, contributions made by the individual's spouse, whether statutory or common-law. Indirect contributions by an entity include, but are not limited to, contributions made through the officers, owners, attorneys, or registered lobbyists of the entity.

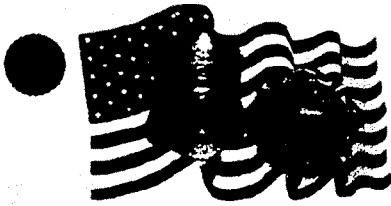


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVE OAK, TEXAS:


1. Some firefighters and peace officers make the ultimate sacrifice of giving their lives to protect us. It is important to recognize the ultimate sacrifice these men and women made protecting us, our families, and our businesses. The departments involved and the surviving family members believe a memorial should be built in downtown San Antonio to honor these heroes.

2. To do this, a nonprofit corporation has been organized to build a memorial in downtown San Antonio. Although the exact location and design have yet to be finalized, the City of San Antonio wants to raise \$100,000 before they will commit to donating a location. Financial support of the citizens and businesses of our community is needed.
