RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE ALAMO AREA FIRE & POLICE MEMORIAL

WHEREAS, fire fighters dedicate their lives to protecting our homes and our lives from fire. Some enter flaming buildings to save our family, friends, and neighbors. Some respond to our traffic accidents, use the "jaws of live" to free us, and perform emergency medical services at the scene to save us; and

WHEREAS, similarly, Federal, State, County and local police safeguard us, our families, and our businesses every minute of every day. They respond to our urgent calls. They engage criminals to every extent imaginable. They put their lives on the line for us;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVE OAK, TEXAS:

- 1. Some firefighters and peace officers make the ultimate sacrifice of giving their lives to protect us. It is important to recognize the ultimate sacrifice these men and women made protecting us, our families, and our businesses. The departments involved and the surviving family members believe a memorial should be built in downtown San Antonio to honor these heroes.
- 2. To do this, a nonprofit corporation has been organized to build a memorial in downtown Sar Antonio. Although the exact location and design have yet to be finalized, the City of San Antonio wants to raise \$100,000 before they will commit to donating a location. Financial support of the citizens and businesses of our community is needed.
  - 3. The City of Live Oak offers its support of the "Alamo Area Fire & Police Memorial". PASSED and APPROVED this the 25th day of June, 2002.
