


### Political Contributions

Any individual or business entity seeking a discretionary contract from the city must disclose in connection with a proposal for a discretionary contract all political contributions totaling one hundred dollars (\$100) or more within the past twenty-four (24) months made directly or indirectly to any *current or former member* of City Council, any *candidate* for City Council, or to any *political action committee* that contributes to City Council elections, by any individual or business entity whose identity must be disclosed under (1), (2) or (3) above. Indirect contributions by an individual include, but are not limited to, contributions made by the individual's spouse, whether statutory or common-law. Indirect contributions by an entity include, but are not limited to, contributions made through the officers, owners, attorneys, or registered lobbyists of the entity.

## Pop Warner Football Association

The Highland Hawks is a non-profit organization chartered by the San Antonio Pop Warner Football Conference. We provide an organized football and cheerleading program for the youth of our community. Boys and girls from ages 5 through 13 years participate in our program.

All personnel involved with the Hawks do so strictly on a voluntary basis; from the Board of Directors and concession workers, to the parents who help in maintaining the playing field. We feel the effort and time spent are very rewarding and for a very good cause.

The 2002 Hawks football season was a total success. All of our cheerleaders participated in the San Antonio Pop Warner Cheer Competition; our newest flag football division, the Cubs, completed an undefeated season; the Mitey Mite and Junior Pee Wee divisions both had above average seasons, the boys in the Hawk Pee Wee division were San Antonio city semi-finalists, and the Junior Midget Hawks were crowned San Antonio City Champions on November 9, 2002.
