
I respectfully request concurrence to place on the December 12, 2002 City Council Agenda an ordinance allocating \$1000.00 from the District 6 Contingency Account to the Earl Warren High School PTA. These funds will be used to offset the costs associated with the purchase or construction of a security and display case for former United States Supreme Court Chief Justice Earl Warren's robe.

At the dedication ceremony for the new high school named for the Chief Justice, the brother of Earl Warren donated the robe worn during landmark Supreme Court cases, including *Brown v Board of Education* and *Miranda v Arizona*, among many others. Coming as a complete surprise to the Warren administration and community, provisions for the proper and secure display of the robe were not made.


Staff has reviewed this request and concurs with this action. Your support is appreciated.



* This form is required to be supplemented in the event there is any change in the information under (1), (2), or (3) below, before the discretionary contract is the subject of council action, and no later than five (5) business days after any change about which information is required to be filed.

Disclosure of Parties, Owners, and Closely Related Persons

For the purpose of assisting the city in the enforcement of provisions contained in the City Charter and the code of ethics, an individual or business entity seeking a discretionary contract from the city is required to disclose in connection with a proposal for a discretionary contract:

(1) the identity of any **individual** who would be a party to the discretionary contract;

(2) the identity of any **business entity**¹ that would be a party to the discretionary contract:

Earl Warren High School PTA

and the name of:

(A) any individual or business entity that would be a *subcontractor* on the discretionary contract;

(B) any individual or business entity that is known to be a *partner*, or a *parent* or *subsidiary* business entity, of any individual or business entity who would be a party to the discretionary contract;

¹ A *business entity* means a sole proprietorship, partnership, firm, corporation, holding company, joint-stock company, receivership, trust, unincorporated association, or any other entity recognized by law.


Political Contributions

Any individual or business entity seeking a discretionary contract from the city must disclose in connection with a proposal for a discretionary contract all political contributions totaling one hundred dollars (\$100) or more within the past twenty-four (24) months made directly or indirectly to any *current* or *former member* of City Council, any *candidate* for City Council, or to any *political action committee* that contributes to City Council elections, by any individual or business entity whose identity must be disclosed under (1), (2) or (3) above. Indirect contributions by an individual include, but are not limited to, contributions made by the individual's spouse, whether statutory or common-law. Indirect contributions by an entity include, but are not limited to, contributions made through the officers, owners, attorneys, or registered lobbyists of the entity.

Disclosures in Proposals

Any individual or business entity seeking a discretionary contract with the city shall disclose any known facts which, reasonably understood, raise a question² as to whether any city official or employee would violate Section 1 of Part B, Improper Economic Benefit, by participating in official action relating to the discretionary contract.

² For purposes of this rule, facts are "reasonably understood" to "raise a question" about the appropriateness of official action if a disinterested person would conclude that the facts, if true, require recusal or require careful consideration of whether or not recusal is required.
