### INCARNATE WORD HIGH SCHOOL

#### Dear Councilman Carroll Schubert:

We are sending this correspondence to share some very exciting news for the Incarnate Word High School family. In August of this year our Madrigal Singers received a phone call from The White House asking us to submit a videotaped audition so that we could be considered to perform for people visiting the White House during the Christmas holidays. We were informed that there would be approximately 1,000 submissions from choirs all over the country and that only 20 groups would be invited to sing in this beautiful setting.

After a few rehearsals, the Madrigals taped their audition video consisting of three selections. We were very happy with our submission but knew, upon submission, that the competition would be very tough and we would consider ourselves fortunate just to have been asked to participate in the audition process. A few days passed and we didn't hear anything from The White House. We figured that perhaps we weren't what they were looking for, but held out hope nonetheless.

On October 21st, we received a phone call from Washington, informing us that our prayers had been answered and that, in fact, we were being asked to go to our nation's capitol and sing in the White House East Room. The dates of this trip are December 4th through December 8th, 2002, and would include 19 students, 1 choir director, and a minimum of 4 chaperones. Our girls and their families are, of course, honored by this invitation and are extremely eager and excited to participate in this beautiful time of celebration.

As you may conclude by now, this is where we need your help. Unfortunately, the funds for this trip are simply not available in our school budget at this time. We ask by this letter that you consider sponsoring our Madrigal Singers with whatever financial gift you can contribute to help make this wonderful opportunity possible for our girls. If you are not able to contribute financially at this time, we ask for your thoughts and prayers to make this trip a reality.

Indirect contributions by an individual include, but are not limited to, contributions made by the individual's spouse, whether statutory or common-law. Indirect contributions by an entity include, but are not limited to, contributions made through the officers, owners, attorneys, or registered lobbyists of the entity.
