AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A \$10,000 GRANT FROM

STATE FARM INSURANCE COMPANY

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

This ordinance authorizes the acceptance of a grant in the amount of \$10,000 from State Farm Insurance Company to upgrade the current network infrastructure and bandwidth at the St. Mary's Learning and Leadership Development Center (LLDC) during the period starting February 1, 2003 through December 10, 2003. Furthermore, this ordinance authorizes the budget for the project.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On December 18, 2002, the State Farm Insurance Company notified the Department of Community Initiatives of receipt of a grant in the amount of \$10,000 to upgrade the current network infrastructure and bandwidth to provide a faster capability at St. Mary's LLDC. Upgrades will be made to the 20-station computer lab, 12 laptop computers donated by St. Mary's University, five TANF computers provided by AWD, and two computers used by administrative support staff. Of the 39 upgraded computers, 37 will be available for use by the community.

The upgrading of the 12 laptop computers will strengthen our capacity to support the proposed Distance Learning Project, which is a collaboration between the Mexican Consulate, St. Mary's University and St. Mary's LLDC. Upgrades possible through this State Farm grant will also benefit all participants served at this center. During FY 02, the St. Mary's LLDC served a total of 2,851 participants through adult basic education, citizenship, ESL, and GED classes.

With the upgrades, the LLDC will have the capability to offer Internet classes to the community. Currently the LLDC offers Microsoft technology classes in Spanish through the use of a volunteer instructor. At the end of the course students are tested to determine progress. Upon successful completion of an examination, students receive a Certificate of Completion.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This action is a continuation of existing City policy to provide human development opportunities to individuals over the age of 17 and help prepare adult learners to be better job candidates. It supports the City's effort to raise the education and skill level of San Antonio residents. These classes will help participants become more knowledgeable in the use of technology and more marketable to employers.

FISCAL IMPACT

The ordinance authorizes the acceptance of a \$10,000.00 grant from State Farm Insurance Company to implement the project. This grant does not require a match or additional general funds.

COORDINATION

Coordination has occurred with St. Mary's University, the Mexican Consulate, the City's Attorney's Office, Finance Department, and the Information Technology Services Department.

SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS

Provisions of the Ethics Ordinance do not apply.
