SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance provides for the approval of three (3) separate License Agreements with 1) Hi Tech Electric L.L.C., 2) Associated Operations, Inc. d/b/a Harper Wood Electric Company (SWDBE), and 3) Edlen Electrical Exhibition Services of Texas, Inc. for an approved list of three (3) contractors to provide temporary utility services including electrical power, water and compressed air for individual events/functions at the Henry B. González Convention Center, Lila Cockrell Theatre, Municipal Auditorium, Alamodome, and Nelson W. Wolff Municipal Stadium and authorizes the City Manager to execute the Agreements with a primary three (3)-year term commencing March 15, 2003 and expiring March 14, 2006 with one (1) additional one (1)-year renewal option and provides for payment to the City of 25% of all Contractor's receipts, after sales taxes, generated thereunder with projected total annual revenues averaging \$435,733.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In anticipation of the expiration of the Utility Service License Agreements, City Staff initiated a Request for Qualification (RFQ) process on December 22, 2002 for interested parties to respond with submittals by January 21, 2003. A Coordination Committee comprised of representatives from Convention Facilities, the Alamodome, Economic Development, the Contract Services Division of Asset Management, the Office of Management and Budget, and the City Attorney's Office was formed to review the RFQ and contract.

The RFO was advertised in the San Antonio Express News on Sunday, December 22, 2002, La Prensa de San Antonio on Sunday, December 22, 2002, and the Commercial Recorder on Monday, December 23, 2002. The RFQ was posted on the City's website and displayed on TVSA-21 from December 23, 2002 through January 21, 2003. On December 23, 2002 department staff called the three (3) current Contractors to confirm current addresses, to notify them that the RFO had been advertised and that it was available on the City's RFP website. Six (6) contractors, 1) Hi Tech Electric L.L.C., 2) Associated Operations, Inc. d/b/a Harper Wood Electric Company (SWDBE), 3) Edlen Electrical Exhibition Services of Texas, Inc., 4) GES Exposition Services d/b/a Tradeshow Electric, 5) Smart City Networks, and 6) Gerard Electric, obtained RFQ's and attended the Pre-Submission Conference held on January 8, 2003. Four (4) proposals were received from 1) Hi Tech Electric L.L.C., 2) Associated Operations, Inc. d/b/a Harper Wood Electric Company (SWDBE), 3) Edlen Electrical Exhibition Services of Texas, Inc., and 4) GES Exposition Services d/b/a Tradeshow Electric. The vendors were evaluated based upon their responses to a Request for Qualifications and were required to meet the following minimum qualifications:

- 1. A minimum of five (5) years in business.
- 2. A minimum of five (5) years experience providing similar services as defined in the RFQ, and having serviced at least one (1) trade exposition or convention that equals or exceeds 200,000 square feet in each of those five (5) years.
- 3. Maintain a locally headquartered or branch office in the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, the San Antonio extra-territorial jurisdiction (ETJ), or in Bexar County, Texas, for the term of the License Agreement.
- 4. Show proof of insurability and bonding as required in the Certification of Minimum Qualifications Form.

The three (3) vendors that met these minimum qualifications and met all of the submittal requirements were 1) Hi Tech Electric L.L.C., 2) Associated Operations, Inc. d/b/a Harper Wood Electric Company (SWDBE), and 3) Edlen Electrical Exhibition Services of Texas, Inc. The submittal received from GES Exposition Services d/b/a Tradeshow Electric was considered non-responsive due to missing required information relative to 1) proof of performance bond and insurance; 2) staff qualifications/resumes; 3) a proposed price list to include overtime rates; 4) failure to provide an executed License Agreement; 5) and other required submittals.

Harper Wood Electric, Edlen Electrical, and Trade Show Electric held the previous contracts for Utility Service Concessions at the Henry B. González Convention Center, Lila Cockrell Theatre, Municipal Auditorium, Alamodome, and the Nelson Wolff Municipal Stadium from March 15, 1999 through March 14, 2003.

The expiring contracts required the Contractors to pay the City an 18% commission of Gross Sales after sales taxes are paid. City revenue from the Utility Service Concessions for the past four (4) fiscal years has been as follows:

POLICY ANALYSIS

By providing an approved list, we are able to offer customers multiple choices for services and establish competition while ensuring the service providers meet minimum qualifications and experience. The three (3) proposed Contractors have assured the City that they will make every reasonable business effort to follow the City's SBEDA policies of utilizing local, small, minority and/or women-owned businesses as potential suppliers to assist in the performance of their contract. The three (3) proposed Contractors have also agreed to establish and maintain a local office for the initial term and any renewal terms.

FISCAL IMPACT

The new contracts require the Contractors that are selected to the approved list to pay the facilities a 25% commission of Gross Sales after sales taxes are paid. Projected revenues to the City of San Antonio for the initial term and renewal option are listed below:
