SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance will require Licensed Irrigation Contractors to register annually with the Development Services Department in order to obtain permits to install irrigation systems. The ordinance will also amend the budget to allow for the collection of fees and expenditure of funds in order to hire two additional plumbing inspectors. This ordinance was prepared as the result of a six-signature memo, at the request of Councilman Bobby Perez.

The intent of this ordinance is to provide protection for consumers from the installation of faulty, water wasting, or inferior irrigation systems by requiring permitting and inspection of irrigation systems. Currently, Irrigation Contractors are licensed by the State of Texas to install commercial and residential irrigation systems. This ordinance will require Licensed Irrigation Contractors to register annually with the Development Services Department in order to obtain permits to install irrigation systems. These irrigation systems are installed in accordance with Chapter 34 of the Texas Water Code. The applicable section of the Texas Water Code is also referenced in section 35-510(j) of the Unified Development Code.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

A six signature memo directed staff to bring forward an irrigation ordinance that:

- -Requires registration of licensed irrigation contractors.
- -Creates two additional Plumbing Inspector Positions.
- -Establishes fees to pay for additional Plumbing Inspector Positions.

The Green Industry Alliance (GIA) worked closely with SAWS to develop the initial draft of the ordinance.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This ordinance is consistent with council policies that promote water conservation. Irrigation systems will require inspection to ensure that they are installed to the applicable standards that provide for the use of water conservation features.

This ordinance will continue to allow a homeowner to install an irrigation system for their residence, by obtaining an irrigation permit. Also licensed Plumbers, who are also currently registered with the city, will be able to obtain irrigation permits. This is consistent with the provisions of the State Plumbing Law.

FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed ordinance will have an impact on the cost of housing construction, only when irrigation systems are installed at the option of the homeowner.

The implementation of this ordinance will require at least two additional inspections. To account for these additional inspections, two (2) additional plumbing inspectors at a first year cost of \$94,453 (six-month funding) are proposed. The recommended fees will provide funding for the additional positions. The fees are as follows:

Annual Irrigation Contractor Registration Fee	\$75.00
Commercial Landscape Irrigation System Permit Fee	\$100.00
Residential Landscape Irrigation System Permit Fee	\$50.00
Irrigation System Inspection Fee	\$34.00

We anticipate that the proposed fees will generate \$119,569 the first year (7 month of revenue) and \$294,975 annually.

COORDINATION

The development of this ordinance has been coordinated with SAWS.

Please join with me in directing staff to have placed on the first available City Council agenda, for final consideration and action, the adoption of an ordinance that protects the City's water source and consumers from the adverse effects of faulty irrigation system installation.

The attached draft ordinance would amend Chapter 16 Licenses and Business Regulations of the City Code, by adding a new article entitled Article XV. Irrigation Contractors relating to registration of irrigation contractors. The Ordinance would protect both the City's water supply and consumers by:

- 1. Requiring irrigation contractors to register annually through the Development Services Department of the City in order to obtain an irrigation system permit for the installation of an irrigation system or a plumbing permit for the installation of an irrigation back-flow prevention device;
- 2. Creating two additional City Plumbing Inspector positions;
- 3. Designating the fees generated by the Irrigation Inspection Fee, Landscape Irrigation System Permit Fee, and Irrigation Contractor Registration Fees to be designated to fund the two additional City

Plumbing Inspector positions and for a City Irrigation System Education Fund.

4. Create a fee schedule adopting a Landscape Irrigation Inspection Fee of \$22.00, a Landscape Irrigation System Permit Fee of \$75.00 and an Irrigation Contractor Registration Fee of \$75.00.

This ordinance is necessary to protect the City's water supply by preventing waste through requiring irrigation contractors to register annually as well as allow for inspections of irrigation systems installed within the limits of the City.

Your concurrent is greatly appreciated.

AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING CHAPTER 16 LICENSES AND **BUSINESS** REGULATIONS OF THE CITY CODE BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE ENTITLED ARTICLE XV**IRRIGATION** CONTRACTORS RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF IRRIGATION CONTRACTORS; **CREATING** TWO **(2)** ADDITIONAL CITY PLUMBING INSPECTOR POSITIONS.

WHEREAS, City Council desires to promote and protect the health and general welfare of the City by protecting the City's water sources by ensuring the proper installation of irrigation systems and backflow prevention devices;

WHEREAS, City Council also desires to protect consumers from the installation of faulty or inferior irrigation systems;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. Section 16 Licenses and Business Regulations of the City Code is amended by adding a new article entitled Article XV. Irrigation Contractors having the sections and containing the language as set forth in the Appendix I of this ordinance which is hereby adopted and approved as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. There are hereby created two additional City Plumbing Inspector positions.

SECTION 3. All fees authorized by Section 16-417 of Appendix I hereto shall be used to fund the two additional City Plumbing Inspector positions:

Any surplus, after funding the two additional City Plumbing Inspector positions, will be placed in the City Irrigation System Education Fund and maintained separately from the General Fund

SECTION 4. The two City Plumbing Inspector positions funded by the fees described above shall either be filled by licensed irrigators under Chapter 34 of the Texas Water Code or persons who shall obtain such licensure within six (6) months of being employed by the City.

Any surplus, after funding the two additional City Plumbing Inspector positions, will be placed in the City Irrigation System Education Fund and maintained separately from the General Fund.

SECTION 5. The City Irrigation System Education Fund will be used to provide education regarding water conservation methods related to irrigation systems.

The City Irrigation System Education Fund will be managed by a committee made up of the following members:

- a. One (1) member of the City Legal Department;
- b. The Chief City Plumbing Inspector; and
- c. Two (2) Licensed Irrigators under Chapter 34 of the Texas Water Code.

SECTION 6. The Lawn Sprinkler (per Head) fee of \$2.85 is eliminated.

SECTION 7. Should any Articles, Section, Parts, Paragraph, Sentence, Phrase, Clause or Word of this Ordinance or the appendix thereof, for any reason be held illegal, inoperative, or invalid or if any exception to or limitation upon any general provision herein contained be held unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective, the remainder shall, nevertheless, stay effective and invalid as if it had been enacted and ordained without the portion held to be held unconstitutional, or invalid, or ineffective.

SECTION 8. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this ordinance is adopted was open to the public, and public notice, the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including, this ordinance was given, all as is required by Texas Revised Civil Statute annotated as amended Title 5, Chapter 551 Government Code. A public hearing was held prior to the adoption of this ordinance as required by V.T.C.A., Local Government Code Section 212.003.

SECTION 9. The City Clerk is directed to publish public notice of this ordinance in accordance with State Law.

SECTION 10. The publishers of the City and the Unified Development Code are authorized to amend said Codes to reflect the change as adopted herein.

Article XV. Irrigation Contractors

Section 16-411. Definitions

"Irrigation Contractor" means a licensed irrigator under Chapter 34 of the Texas Water Code.

"Irrigation System" means any in ground irrigation system of lawn, shrubbery, and other vegetation from any water source including the water supply piping, valves and sprinkler heads or other irrigation outlets but does not include the back flow prevention device or the final connection of the irrigation system to the back flow prevention device. Irrigation System does not include an irrigation system used primarily for agricultural purposes.

"Installation" or "Install" means fabrication of an irrigation system using components that include piping, fittings, valves, sprinkler heads and pumps; replacement, repair, alteration or maintenance of a lawn sprinkler system components; or lawn sprinkler system site preparation, including digging, trenching, Vibratory Flow operation, and final grading.

Section 16-412. Registration

In order to obtain an irrigation system permit for the installation of an irrigation system or a plumbing permit for the installation of an irrigation back flow prevention device from the Development Services Department of the City, an irrigation contractor shall register annually with the Development Services Department of the City. Registration must be submitted on forms available from the Development Services Department and shall include the following information:

- a. The irrigation contractor's full name, state irrigator's license number, business name, business address, business telephone number and fax numbers.
- b. The names and license numbers of all licensed irrigation contractors or licensed plumbers that the irrigation contractor employs or with whom the irrigation contractor enters into a contract for the lawn sprinkler connection and inspection services.

Such registration shall expire December 31st of each year. Registration may be renewed for a period of one year from each succeeding December 31st upon submission by the irrigation contractor of the registration form. It shall be unlawful to obtain an irrigation system permit, or a plumbing permit to install a back flow prevention device without first registering annually with the Development Services Department of the City.

Section 16-413. Fees

The registration fee shall be as set forth in the Fee Schedule in Section 16-417 and paid annually. All registration fees shall be paid to the director of the Development Services Department of the City.

Section 16-414. Inspection and Testing of Irrigation Systems

All irrigation systems installed in the City, on or after the effective date of this ordinance, shall be permitted with the Development Services Department on forms provided by the Department.

Upon the completion of the installation of an irrigation system a City Plumbing Inspector shall inspect and determine the following before completing the Irrigation System Installation Permit:

- 1. The irrigation contractor is currently registered with the City;
- 2. The irrigation contractor obtained a permit prior to the installation;
- 3. If applicable, the system complies with the requirements of the Unified Development Code;
- 4. The system complies with the requirements of Chapter 34 of the Texas Water Code.

Any defects in the installation determined during the inspection shall be corrected before the inspection is considered complete. The City Plumbing Inspector shall also include on the Irrigation System Installation Permit information on the system including static pressure and water source.

Section 16-415.

It shall be unlawful to install an irrigation system with the City, without obtaining an irrigation system permit from the Development Services Department of the City.

Section 16-416. Fines and Penalties.

Any violation of this Article shall be a Class C misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$1,000.00 per violation.

Section 16-417.

The following fee schedule is hereby adopted:

Irrigation Contractor Registration Fee	\$75.00
Landscape Irrigation System Permit Fee	\$75.00
Irrigation System Inspection Fee	\$22.00


