SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance accepts a proposal and awards a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funded professional service contract in the amount of \$57,694.00 payable to Bain Medina Bain, Inc., a non-MBE firm, for engineering services and \$5,800.00 for engineering contingency for an overall total amount of \$63,494.00 in connection with the Ogden from Dewey to Ashby and E. Courtland from Main to McCullough projects located in Council District 1.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance authorizes compensation to Bain Medina Bain, Inc. for basic engineering services through final design phase, geotechnical service, pavement design, Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) review, and bidding phase service for the Ogden from Dewey to Ashby and E. Courtland from Main to McCullough projects. The scope for these projects provides for design only and will reconstruct the streets with curbs and sidewalks. The selection of this consultant was accomplished through a Request for Qualifications process for the 28th Year Community Development Block Grant projects with twenty (20) firms responding. The Architects and Engineering Selection Committee selected Bain Medina Bain, Inc., which rated 2nd highest of the 20 firms for one of three projects available. This contract will initiate the design phase of this project and is scheduled for completion by February 2004.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved CDBG funded Capital Improvements Projects.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY03-08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. This item represents a portion of a total estimated City project cost of \$80,000.00. Funds in the amount of \$63,494.00 are available from CDBG funds and authorized payable as follows:


