### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance accepts a proposal and awards professional service contract for architectural services in the amount of \$60,000.00, payable to the Arizpe Group, Inc., an MBE/DBE firm, and authorizes \$10,000.00 for architectural contingency, and \$800.00 for advertising expenses, for an overall total of \$70,800.00 funded from the Library Gift & Memorial fund, in connection with the Skylight and Roof at Central Library project located at 600 Soledad in Council District 1.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

This ordinance provides compensation to The Arizpe Group, Inc. for architectural design service for repairing or replacing the existing skylight system and roofing at the Central Library. Ongoing skylight leaks have been unsuccessfully sealed and are causing damage to interior finishes. Roof leaks in multiple locations are also contributing to the damage. A preliminary design study will include a survey to determine whether correctives can be made or a new roof is necessary. A map of the project location is included (see attachment #1). This project will begin the preliminary design phase by May 2003.

The selection of this consultant was accomplished through a Request for Qualifications process with six (6) firms responding (see attachment #2). The Architects and Engineer Selection Committee selected The Arizpe Group, Inc. which rated highest of the six firms proposals submitted. The Arizpe Group, Inc. is working with ISES on drawings of 23 City of San Antonio Buildings, 21 of which are library buildings, and has no other project with the City at this time.

### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of Council policy to construct approved 2001 Certificate of Obligation funded projects.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and is not included in the Capital Improvement Program Budget. These items represent a portion of a total estimated City project cost of \$550,800.00. Funds in the amount of \$70,800.00 are to be appropriated, are available from the Library Gift and Memorial Fund, and authorized payable as follows:

\$60,000.00 payable to The Arizpe Group, Inc. for architectural service

\$10,000.00 payable for contingency

\$ 800.00 payable for advertising expenses

### **COORDINATION**

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget, the Finance Department, and the Department of Asset Management.



Dear Mr. Hensley:

The Arizpe Group, Inc. (TAG) is pleased to submit the attached fee proposal for services to investigate and assess the roofing and moisture protection for the San Antonio Central Library.

TAG desires to perform all roofing and moisture protection projects on a three-phase basis as follows:

**Phase 1 ~ Assessment:** Roof and moisture infiltration survey, analysis, testing, recommendations, skylight renovation or replacement assessment, scheduling of projects and Opinion of Estimated Construction Costs. TAG will utilize the services of Edis Oliver & Associates, Engineers & Roof Consultants and Texas Skylights to assist in the investigation and assessment process.

Phase 2 ~ A/E Construction Documents and Bidding: Prepare plans and technical specifications for the work based upon the findings and decisions of Phase 1.

Phase 3 ~ Construction Administration: To include conducting periodic field observations, approving material submittals and assist the city with project closeout.

This proposal is for the **Phase 1** work only. Phase 1 would include the following services:

- 1) Review of owner as-built plans, on-site observations and digital photographs.
- 2) Conversion of as-builts to CAD roof plan with relevant wall and skylight sections utilizing AutoCAD R.14.
- 3) Forensic analysis of roof, skylights and walls.
- 4) Investigation of areas that may be admitting moisture.
  - a) Perform infrared or other type of non-destructive moisture scan to determine condition of underlying components and substrate and locations of wet insulation.
  - b) Skylight disassembly for intensive detail investigation.
- 5) Recommendations of scope of work for Phase II.
- 6) Opinion of Estimated Construction Cost to address recommendations in the Scope of Work.

- 7) Scheduling scenarios for preparing construction documents, bidding and estimated schedule of construction to achieve substantial completion.
- 8) Final A/E report containing findings and recommendations.

TAG proposes a fee for the Phase 1 ~ Assessment of \$17,500. We have attached Schedule A, which further outlines our fee proposal for this work. We expect the Phase I work to take 30 calendar days from the written receipt of a notice to proceed.

We thank you for this work, and hope you find this proposal satisfactory.
