#### SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This Ordinance will close, vacate and abandon an unimproved portion of Bulverde Road located directly north of Loop N 1604 E adjacent to NCB 17727, as requested by FCS Fischer, Ltd., a Texas limited partnership, for the consideration of \$5,605.00.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Petitioner is requesting the closure, vacation and abandonment of an unimproved portion of Bulverde Road located directly north of Loop N 1604 E adjacent to NCB 17727 as shown on attached Exhibit "A." The proposed closure is outside of the 120 feet of right of way proposed for Bulverde Road. The petitioner owns the abutting property and if approved, would like to incorporate the closure with their property for future commercial development.

#### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

This action is consistent with City Ordinances regulating the closure, vacation and abandonment of Public Right of Way within the Corporate Limits of the City of San Antonio.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The City will collect \$5,605.00 as consideration for this closure, vacation and abandonment of Public Right of Way.

#### **COORDINATION**

In compliance with City procedures, this request has been canvassed through interested City departments, public utilities and applicable agencies. A Canvassing Checklist and an executed Letter of Agreement, by which the petitioner agrees with all conditions imposed through this canvassing, are attached for review.

#### **SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS**

The City of San Antonio's Planning Commission will consider this request at its regular meeting of 3/26/2003 and its finding will be presented to City Council on 4/3/2003.





Dear Ms. Weaver:

With reference to the captioned project, please be advised that the City of San Antonio has now completed the canvassing process and will recommend approval of your request subject to the following conditions:

#### PLANNING:

"Bulverde Road is part of the Major Thoroughfare road system for the City of San Antonio requiring a minimum of 120-feet of right of way. Therefore, request is approved provided the existing Preliminary Overall Area Development Plan (POADP) #457 is modified to reflect the additional property being added; approved Steubing Estate North Master Development Plan (MDP) #706-A, lies across from this site and future improvements to Bulverde Road may impact the property in question; at the time of development the petitioner must file a formal subdivision plat vacating and replatting the area as per Article IV Procedures, Division 4 Subdivisions of the Unified Development Code (UDC) for the City of San Antonio; and all existing utility easements must be preserved in order to minimize any relocation of such utilities now or in the future resulting from any anticipated new construction when possible."

#### PUBLIC WORKS:

"Approved provided the 0.60 acres be retained as a drainage easement until removed with Development/Platting of this property; and must retain right of way necessary for proposed southbound right turn lane at north end of the tract in accordance with recently submitted plat."

#### **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES:**

"Approved provided spacing with a minimum of 120-feet of right of way is retained to meet major thoroughfare requirements. In addition, proposed closure should be platted and incorporated with the petitioners property."

#### CITY PUBLIC SERVICE:

"Approved provided easement is retained for any existing CPS facilities, or if feasible, remove/relocate facilities at petitioner's expense."

#### **SAN ANTONIO WATER SYSTEM:**

"Approved provided any existing SAWS utility is provided with a variable width easement to a maximum width of sixteen (16) feet. Petitioner will be solely responsible for the relocation of any SAWS utility located thereon."

#### DEPARTMENT OF ASSET MANAGEMENT:

- The closure, vacation and abandonment of this public right of way will be authorized by a City Ordinance.
- Petitioner asserts that all evidence of ownership of all property abutting the public right of way proposed to be closed, vacated and abandoned by the City of San Antonio is true and correct.
- The petitioner acknowledges that this property will be accepted in its "as is" condition.
- Petitioner agrees to reserve a perpetual easement for all existing overhead, surface or subsurface utilities within the public right of way proposed to be closed, including but not limited to: electrical, water, sewer, telephone, cable, fiber optic conduit, etc. Petitioner agrees to allow perpetual access to any such utilities or may seek the relocation of a specific utility with the express permission and coordination of the respective owner of the utility and at the sole expense of the petitioner.
- Petitioner agrees to pay a closure fee of \$5,605.00, which includes the assessed value of \$5,503.00 for the public right of way, a fee of \$72.00 for posting of signs notifying the public of the proposed street closure, and a fee of \$30.00 for recordation of the City Ordinance. This closure fee will be due and payable to the City of San Antonio prior to City Council consideration. If for some reason the closure is not approved by City Council, the closure fee will be refunded to the petitioner, less the fee for posting of the notification sign and the recording fee. Further, deeds for your abutting property are also required.

This Letter of Conditions is being offered by City of San Antonio only to the petitioner named above and will expire thirty (30) days after date of issuance unless a specific extension is requested by the petitioner and granted by the City.

If you concur with the above mentioned conditions, including the payment of the assessed closure fee, please countersign this letter in the space provided below and return to the undersigned. Upon receipt of this executed Letter of Agreement, property deeds and the payment we will continue processing your request.
