SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This Ordinance rescinds the license agreements approved by Ordinance Nos. 61887 (11/25/85) and 62468 (3/13/86) with the Fairmount Hotel Company and authorizes a license agreement with Patriot American Hospitality, a Virginia Limited Partnership, for the use of Public Right of Way for two (2) existing porches, four (4) existing areaways at the southwest corner of Alamo and Nueva Streets and an existing porte cochere on Alamo Street, at the Fairmount Hotel located at 401 South Alamo, within New City Block 155, for a total license fee of \$12,139.00 for a 10-year term.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Petitioner is requesting a renewal of two (2) licenses to use Public Right of Way for two (2) existing porches, four (4) existing areaways at the southwest corner of Alamo and Nueva Streets and an existing porte cochere on Alamo Street, at the Fairmount Hotel, located at 401 South Alamo, in New City Block 155, as shown on Exhibit "A". The City of San Antonio entered into two (2) license agreements by Ordinance Nos. 61887 (11/25/85) and 62468 (3/13/86), with Fairmount Hotel Company for these encroachments. Patriot American Hospitality, a Virginia Limited Partnership, acquired their interest in the hotel from Fairmount Hospitality, a Texas Partnership, on October 2, 1995. A new license agreement is required as the rights granted by the previous licenses are not assignable.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This action is consistent with the City Code and Ordinances, which require City Council approval for any private use of property owned or controlled by the City.

FISCAL IMPACT

The City will collect \$12,139.00 for this license to use Public Right of Way for a 10-year term.

COORDINATION

In compliance with City procedures, this request has been canvassed through interested City departments, public utilities and applicable agencies. A Canvassing Checklist and an executed Letter of Agreement, by which the petitioner agrees with all conditions imposed through this canvassing, are attached for review.






Map of Subject Property
