SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance accepts the low qualified responsive bid and awards a construction contract in the amount of \$189,207.05 payable to San Antonio Constructors, Ltd., a non-MBE firm, and authorizes \$11,631.00 for construction contingency expenses, \$900.00 for construction engineering expenses, payable to Jaster-Quintanilla San Antonio, LLP, for an overall total of \$201,738.05 in connection with the Monticello from S. Gevers to Hillje project, an authorized 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond project, located in Council District 3. Of the \$201,738.05, \$124,000.00 will be funded from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funds, \$4,849.74 will be funded from 2002 Certificates of Obligation and \$72,888.31 will be funded by San Antonio Water System (SAWS) for water work.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Monticello from S. Gevers to Hillje project provides for a 30 foot wide, two (2) lane street section with necessary drainage. The project will recontruct Monticello from S. Gevers to Hillje and includes four (4) foot sidewalks, curbs and driveway approaches.

While this project was originally identified as a 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond Project, project costs have increased due to inflation. Therefore, it is necessary to use resources from Certificates of Obligation to support the increase.

This ordinance provides for additional compensation to Jaster-Quintanilla San Antonio, LLP for professional engineering services related with the construction contract administration of this project. This professional service contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No.92425 on August 31, 2000 and initially authorized \$29,965.00 for the original scope of services related to this project. This Council action will increase the total, to date, authorized for this professional service contract to \$30,865.00. This project is scheduled to begin construction May 2003 and be completed by August 2003.

This project was advertised for construction bids in the Commercial Recorder, the San Antonio Informer, and La Prensa in January 2003. In addition, the bid announcement was made on TVSA, through the SBEDA office and Dodge Report. Plans were also available for review by potential bidders in the Public Works Office.

Bids for this project were opened on March 5, 2003 with six (6) bidders responding. A matrix reflecting the outcome of the bid process is attached.

The Economic Development Department has reviewed the Good Faith Effort Plan and List of Subcontractors submitted for this project and determined that since the total bid amount is under \$200,000 a Good Faith Effort plan is not required. The contract provides for 50 working days or approximately three (3) months, to complete the project. San Antonio Constructors, Ltd. currently has 8 (eight) construction contracts with the City of San Antonio in the total amount of \$7,501,663.15. A list of these projects is attached.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funded Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the current Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$124,000.00 are available from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds, \$4,849.74 are available from 2002 Certificates of Obligation, and \$72,888.31 will be funded from SAWS for sewer and water work, for an overall total of \$201,738.05 to be authorized payable as follows:

\$189,207.05	payable to San Antonio Constructors, Ltd., for construction expenses
\$ 11,631.00	payable for construction contingency
\$ 900.00	payable to Jaster-Quintanilla San Antonio, LLP, for engineering services

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget, and the Finance Department.

SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS

This construction contract was developed utilizing the formal competitive bid process; therefore, a Discretionary Contracts Disclosure Form is not required. However, because we are providing additional contingency to the professional service contract, a Discretionary Contracts Disclosure Form is required for Jaster-Quintanilla San Antonio, LLP.



It is understood that the following quantities of work to be done are approximate only, and are intended principally to serve as a guide in figuring out the bids.

It is understood and agreed that the work is to be completed in full in <u>fifty (50)</u>
working days.

Accompanying this Proposal is a Bid Guaranty in the amount of five placest Dollars (\$ 5/0 July) said amount being fine per cent of the total bid. Said Bid Guaranty, in the form of a Certified or Cashier's Check on a State or National Bank, or Bid Bond, is submitted as a guaranty of the good faith of the Bidder and that the Bidder will execute and enter into a written contract to do the work, if his bid is accepted. It is hereby agreed that the Bidder may, at any time prior to opening of the bids withdraw this Proposal without penalty; it is also agreed that if Bidder shall, at any time after opening of bids, withdraw this Proposal or if this Bid is accepted and Bidder shall fail to execute the written contract and furnish satisfactory bond, within twenty (20) days after the date of transmittal of the contract documents by Owner to Contractor, the City of San Antonio shall, in any of such events, be entitled and is hereby given the right to retain said Bid Guaranty as liquidated damages. It is understood that the City of San Antonio reserves the right to reject any and all bids whenever the City Council deems it in the interest of the City to do so, and also the right to waive any informalities in a bid.
