SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends a professional service contract and authorizes additional funds in the amount of \$5,265.00 payable to Fernandez, Frazer, White & Associates, Inc., a MBE firm, for professional services in connection with the Lanark Drainage #92A, Phase I project. This is an authorized 1987 and 1999 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funded project located in City Council District 10.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance requests additional compensation to Fernandez, Frazer, White & Associates, Inc. for engineering services to address the environmental concerns of this project. These services will include the following:

- Add the Waste Management Plan to the specs, cost estimate, proposal, and the plans.
- Provide reduced sized copies of the channel plans and profiles highlighting the contaminated area, including channel cross sections will also be provided.
- Calculate the cubic yards of contaminated material to be removed from the contaminated area. The quantity of material to be removed shall be based on excavating one foot from the sides and bottom of the existing channel.

This project is currently under final design and is scheduled to advertise for bids in August 2003, begin construction in November 2003, and be completed by November 2004.

This professional service contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 67657 on August 4, 1988 and initially authorized \$131,243.13 for services related to this project. Subsequent City Council action and administrative adjustments increased funds for this project in the total amount of \$184,508.22, and brought the total contract value to \$315,751.35. This Council action will increase the total amount authorized for this professional service contract to \$321,016.35.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 1987 and 1999 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funded Capital Improvement projects.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$5,265.00 are available from the 1999 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funds and authorized payable to Fernandez, Frazer, White & Associates, Inc.

This item represents a portion of a total estimated cost of \$2,793,210.00.

COORDINATION

This request for Ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.



Dear Mr. Bloom

Our lump sum fee for providing additional engineering Services associated with incorporating a Waste Management Plan into the project documents for the Lanark Project is \$5,265.00. This fee includes the scope of work as outlined in your letter of March 17, 2003. The following task will be accomplished in performance of the scope of work.

- 1. Conduct a site inspection to define the existing limits and size of rubble in the creek.
- 2. Develop ½ size, (11" X 17"), plan files of the channel plan profiles and cross section sheets from existing plan files.
- 3. Identify and highlight contaminated areas on the $\frac{1}{2}$ size plan profile sheets. Exclude areas with existing poured in place smooth concrete riprap.
- 4. Highlight contaminated areas on the channel cross sections to include a 1 foot thick area below existing channel bank and bed. Determine area (S.F.) of contaminated zone for each cross section. In areas of proposed channel embankment, determine area of additional embankment required due to removal of the 1 foot thick contaminated zone. Sections containing existing poured in place smooth concrete riprap will be excluded.
- 5. Compute in place volume of contaminated material in Cubic Yards. Convert computed quantity to loose cubic yards for use in bid item(s).
- 6. Revise specifications, proposal, cost estimate, and plan index sheet to reflect bid items. Incorporate Waste Management Plan provided by the City into Specifications, revise the Table of Contents and List of Governing Specifications. Unit prices for contaminated bid items shall be provided by the City of San Antonio.
- 7. Fold 11 X 17 channel plan profile and cross section sheets and bind into specification bid sets. 18 sheets per set, 20 sets, 360 sheets

A master set of the highlighted ½ size channel plan profiles and cross sections, specification revisions, proposal revisions and cost estimate will be completed for your review within 12 working days of beginning work.
