#### SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance provides payment in the amount of \$15,249.44 payable to Eagle Construction & Environmental Services, L.P., a non-MBE firm, for environmental remediation services associated with the Mission Trails Package # 3 project, an authorized 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond project located in Council District 3. A previously executed On-Call Professional Services Agreement for Environmental Consulting and Remediation activities with Eagle Construction & Environmental Services, L.P. was approved by City Council on May 30, 2002, through Ordinance No. 95847.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

A Phase II subsurface investigation was recently conducted and identified waste debris within the proposed underground drainage system alignment. The waste debris and associated soil have been slightly impacted by heavy metals. Due to the specific health and safety requirements and waste management procedures associated with this contamination, Eagle Environmental was contracted to address the contamination in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local requirements.

Eagle Construction & Environmental Services, L.P. was contracted to provide mechanical equipment and labor to perform excavation, loading, transportation and disposal services associated with the contamination. Eagle also provided and compacted backfill material in the excavated trench to replace the excavated impacted soil. Approximately 528 cubic yards of impacted soil from the Riverside Golf Course was disposed of at a state approved disposal facility.

The Mission Trails Enhancement project will provide drainage, street, and park improvements to connect the five historic missions. The Mission Trails Package 3 (3A) provides for street and drainage improvements from Hart Ave to Isabel. Also, included are enhancements and hike & bike trails along Mission Road from Southcross to Mitchell, the San Antonio River from Mission Road to Theo, and Theo from the San Antonio River to Mission Road. This project is currently under construction and is scheduled for completion by December 2003.

This professional services contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 95847 on May 30, 2002, and initially authorized \$1,500,000.00 for services.

## **POLICY ANALYSIS**

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funded Capital Improvement Projects. Environmental investigation is a necessary component of the design of Capital Improvement Projects.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and not included in the FY03-08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. This item represents a portion of a total estimated City project cost of \$1,235,233.00. Funds in the amount of \$15,249.44 are available from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funds and authorized payable to Eagle Construction & Environmental Services, L.P.

## **COORDINATION**

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget, the Finance Department, and the Environmental Services Department.





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
