### SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$500.00 payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio for title fees in connection with the Northington – S.W. 36th to S.W. 35th project. This is an authorized 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond project located in Council District 6.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

There are five parcels to acquire in this project. This project is scheduled to be advertised in May 2003, start construction in July 2003, and be completed by January 2004. The scope of this project includes the reconstruction of Northington from S.W. 36<sup>th</sup> to S.W. 35<sup>th</sup> Street to a 30-foot width. The project will also include parkway improvement such as the construction of curbs, sidewalks, driveway approaches, necessary drainage, and utility improvements.

### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

Approval of this ordinance for payment of title charges is necessary to complete the real estate transactions on the acquisition of the properties in this project.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

This is a one time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY03-FY08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$500.00 are available from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds and authorized payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio. This item represents a portion of the total estimated City project cost of \$250,000.00.

### **COORDINATION**

This ordinance was coordinated with the Finance Department, the Office of Management and Budget, and the City Attorney's Office.
