SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$1,920.00, from 1994 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bonds, payable to Dugger, Canaday, Grafe Incorporated for appraisal services and expert testimony in connection with the Babcock Road/Leon Creek Improvements – Hausman to DeZavala, an authorized 1994 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond project, located in Council District 8.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

We have 23 signed instruments and one condemned parcel in the 25-parcel project. remaining parcel has been submitted to the City Attorney's Office to begin condemnation proceedings. This project has completed construction. The scope of this project included the reconstruction of Babcock Road from Hausman to Nickle and from DeZavala to a point west of Spring Rain to a typical 44-foot width. This project also constructed the new location of Babcock Road from Nickel to a point west of Spring Rain to a typical 44-foot width. It also included the construction of new bridges at Huesta and Leon Creeks and new curbs, sidewalks, and driveways.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance for payment of expert testimony is necessary to complete the real estate transactions on the acquisition of the properties in this project.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and is included in the FY03-FY08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. This item represents a portion of a total estimated project cost of \$7,813,204.04. Funds in the amount of \$1,920.00 are available from 1994 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bonds and authorized payable to Dugger, Canaday, Grafe, Incorporated.

COORDINATION

This ordinance was coordinated with the Finance Department, the Office of Management and Budget, and the City Attorney's Office.
