Whereas, the City of San Antonio depends primarily upon the unique Edwards Aquifer for the sole source of drinking water, and;

Whereas, through the concerned efforts of all citizens in San Antonio and the Edwards Aquifer region, water quality and quantity have become issues of grave importance and concern, and;

Whereas, the Edwards Aquifer Authority, created by the Texas Legislature in 1993, has been the instrument through which regional concerns over water quantity have been addressed, and;

Whereas, the Edwards Aquifer Authority presents this region with the only solution to ensure base line water quality requirements and guidelines, ensuring the continued purity of the water pumped from this most precious of natural resources, and;

Whereas, the potential removal of water quality rule making authority from the Edwards Aquifer Authority would remove the potential for protection and continued assurance of the purity of the water in this region.

Now therefore, be it resolved by the City Council of San Antonio, that;

The City of San Antonio hereby calls upon members of the Texas Legislature to provide support for the continued authority of the Edwards Aquifer Authority to have water quality rule-making authority as part of the charge of this entity, and;

The City of San Antonio encourages the members of the Texas Legislature to ensure the legislative intent of the Edwards Aquifer Authority is one that provides the best possible quality of life for all residents of the Edwards Aquifer region by the assurance of water quality and quantity regulation, and;
