SUBJECT: Ordinance Authorizing the expenditure of \$8,400.00 for Fee Simple Title to one parcel in connection with the Octavia Drainage #63, Phase II Part I project

DATE: June 5, 2003

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$8,400.00 payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio as escrow agent for JPMORGAN CHASE BANK, Trustee of the William and Chave Gonzaba Grantor Trust U/A Dated 9/19/89, for fee simple title to one parcel (\$7,800.00), and title fees (\$600.00), in connection with the Octavia Drainage #63, Phase II Part I project, an authorized 1999 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond project, located in Council District 5.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

There are 72 signed instruments in the 74-parcel project. The two remaining parcels are in negotiation. Phase I of this project is complete. Phase II was let for contract in April 2003, and is scheduled to start construction July 2003, and be completed by May 2004. The scope of Phase II provides for underground storm drainage improvements along Hart and Pleasanton Road. Reconstruction will include curbs, four-foot sidewalks, concrete driveway approaches, and retaining walls.

POLICY ANALYSIS

The acquisition of this property is necessary to complete this real estate transaction in this project.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY03-FY08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$8,400.00 are available from 1999 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bonds. This item represents a portion of a total estimated City project cost of \$1,712,860.00.

² For purposes of this rule, facts are "reasonably understood" to "raise a question" about the appropriateness of official action if a disinterested person would conclude that the facts, if true, require recusal or require careful consideration of whether or not recusal is required.
