SUBJECT: Execution of a Contract with the Metropolitan Planning Organization for City

Tasks in the MPO's 2002-03 Unified Planning Work Program

DATE: June 26, 2003

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes the City Manager to execute a contract with the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the City to perform various transportation planning tasks and studies for an amount not to exceed \$65,000 as part of the MPO's Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2002-2003. This amount reflects mid-year adjustments made by the MPO to account for changes in available federal and state transportation planning funds.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On March 28, 2002 City Council by ordinance approved a proposed list of transportation planning programs which were forwarded to the MPO for funding consideration. The MPO's adopted Unified Planning Work Program provides the City with funding to undertake the studies outlined in the following table:

The referenced amounts include mid-year amendments to the current fiscal year by the MPO to account for the changes in federal and state transportation planning funds available to the MPO for planning projects.

City staff support in the MPO's planning process is essential for the coordination and implementation of local transportation planning programs. City staff's involvement in the planning process including participation in committees and task forces that address diverse issues such as air quality, pedestrian and bicycle planning, land use and transportation planning, and corridor planning. Additionally, citizen involvement is an essential requirement for a coordinated, cooperative and comprehensive planning process. The Planning Department will also assist the MPO and member agencies in reviewing and updating elements of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. A mid-year amendment added a task to fund a bicycle plan and coordination of bicycling related projects such as bike to work week and coordinating bicycle projects that are in the MPO's Transportation Improvement Program.

These planning programs ensure continued staff support in this federally funded planning process.

POLICY ANALYSIS

The approved program for transportation planning responds to the planning requirements as established in the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA 21), and reflects the City's continuing commitment to undertake an enhanced transportation planning function.

These studies reflect established planning priorities consistent with the City's Master Plan and constitute the City of San Antonio's role in the coordinated transportation planning process of the Metropolitan Planning Organization.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The MPO's amended Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2002-2003 provides the City with grant funds in the amount of \$65,000.

COORDINATION

This item has been coordinated with the City Attorney's Office and the Public Works Department.
