SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes the acceptance of changes to the Cooperative Agreement with the Air Force related to the ongoing Public Center for Environmental Health (PCEH) in the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District as follows: Reducing the unused FY 2003 funding for the project by \$225,000.00, providing new funding in the amount of \$499,999.22 for project year FY 2004 and authorizing \$150,000.78 in carry-over funds from two previous budget periods to be used in FY 2004. In addition, the ordinance revises the FY 2003 budget, establishes a new program fund, approves the FY 2004 program budget and personnel complement, transfers funds from previous year to the new budget, and authorizes payments for contractual services in connection with the program.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In Ordinance No. 94645 passed and approved September 27, 2001, the City entered into a ten (10) year cooperative agreement with the Secretary of the Air Force for the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District to establish and operate a Public Center for Environmental Health (PCEH).

The mission of PCEH is to conduct scientific evaluations directed toward health impacts from potential exposure to environmental contamination related to releases of hazardous substances from the former Kelly Air Force Base. During fiscal year 2004 the Air Force Real Property Agency will begin installing remediation technology within the residential community near the former Kelly Air Force Base. Citizens have expressed concerns for the possible release of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) during construction of these remediation projects. The PCEH will focus its activities during FY 04 on insuring that residents are not exposed to levels of contaminates that would affect their health. PCEH will accomplish this by providing

technical oversight and air monitoring during the installation of the four (4) remediation projects located within the residential community. PCEH currently has seven (7) personnel positions (See Attachment I); no change in the number from last year.

Funding is also included for contract physicians and registered nurses for services provided to patients referred by PCEH, and environmental engineering services. Subsequent funds for the remaining term of this ten (10) year agreement will be provided through periodic contract amendments and submitted for City Council approval.

POLICY ANALYSIS

The total budget for FY 2003 was initially \$725,000.00. Due to a Department of Defense budget realignment the Air Force requested a withdrawal of \$225,000.00 from the FY 2003 budget. It is important to note that the \$5,000,000.00 allocated for this project over its ten (10) year life span will not be affected by the reduction in FY 2003. These funds can still be made available in future years, with appropriate justification.

For the third year of operation, October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004, the funding support from the Air Force will be \$650,000.00. This includes \$499,999.22 in new funds plus \$150,000.78 rollover from the two previous years, \$20,000.00 in FY 2002 and \$130,000.78 in FY 2003. These rollovers were approved by the Air Force to continue existing work.

An important section of this ordinance approves payments from the cooperative agreement to Zephyr Environmental Corporation in the amount of \$132,500.00. The City contracted with Zephyr in December, 2001 to provide an independent review and recommendations concerning the Air Force's groundwater treatment options in the Kelly contamination plume. Since its execution, this contract has been paid from the Environmental Services Fund. The Air Force will now allow this to be paid from the PCEH cooperative agreement for FY 2004.

This ordinance follows the City practice of utilizing Federal, State and other funds to provide public health services for the residents of our community.

FISCAL IMPACT

This funding for the PCEH is \$650,000.00. The amount for each succeeding fiscal year will be adjusted by an amendment to the original agreement. The maximum funding for the ten (10) year cooperative agreement is \$5,000,000.00.

Acceptance of this funding will place no demands on the City General Fund.

COORDINATION

The City Attorney's Office and the Office of Management and Budget, Risk Management Division, have reviewed and approved the agreement with the Department of the Air Force. The Finance Department has approved the proposed budget. The SAMHD has coordinated this project with the Departments of Environmental Services and External Relations.

SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS

Provisions of the Ethics Ordinance do not apply.

The revised FY 04Budget in the amount of SEVEN HUNDRED, TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$725,000.00) for the period from 01 October 2003 through 30 September 2004 is approved with the following stipulations:

- The amount requested is comprised of, FOUR HUNDRED, NINETY-NINE THOUSAND, NINE HUNDRED, NINETY-NINE DOLLARS AND TWENTY-TWO CENTS (\$499,999.22) of new dollars and an estimated rollover amount of unexpended funds from FY 02 and FY 03 of ONE HUNDRED, FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS AND SEVENTY-EIGHT CENTS (\$150,000.78). The additional SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000.00) has to be funded by another source. If related to a PCEH project not currently funded within the existing budget, the project may be presented for consideration.
- Per our budget meeting, 10 September 2003, certain line items in the budget needed to be modified.
 - o Time for Mr. Sam Sanchez and Ms. Nichole Ledesma directly related to PCEH activity needs to be submitted with reimbursement packages in the form of monthly time sheets. Please reference previous correspondence as to the proper time sheet submittal. (line item 01-010)
 - o The corresponding Group Health Insurance percentage needs to be submitted in the reimbursement package as well. (line item 01-050)
 - O As stated during the budget meeting, according to OMB Circular A-87, Attachment B, Section 2, paragraph E, the magnets and key chains promoting PCEH is unallowable. Costs of promotional items and memorabilia, including models, gifts and souvenirs; and costs of advertising and public relations designed solely to promote the governmental unit will not be reimbursed.
 - Wage increases will only be accepted when approved by City Council.

o All new positions funded by PCEH will need prior approval.

Approval of the FY 04 budget does not denote full reimbursement on packages submitted. All expenses must be allowable, allocable and reasonable with proper justification. Source documentation must be submitted with reimbursement packages.

Changes to the budget and programmatic changes shall be made in accordance with 32 C.F.R. Section 33.30. Changes that are inconsistent to the cited section shall not be made without the prior written approval of the Air Force.

Kelly AFB Zone 4 Remediation Project

Amendment To Contract Between the City of San Antonio And Zephyr Environmental Corporation

General Description of this Amendment: To effect a change in the scope of an existing professional services environmental engineering contract between the City of San Antonio (City) and Zephyr Environmental Corporation (Zephyr) to allow for additional services, to the benefit of the City, necessary to oversight of the United States Air Force's environmental remediation actions for Kelly AFB Zone 4, for a sum not to exceed \$132,500.00.

Background. This amendment is made to an existing contract between the City and Zephyr approved August 9, 2001, by Ordinance No. 94341, for purposes of independent review and recommendations concerning the United States Air Force's groundwater treatment options for Kelly AFB Zone 4 within the City's jurisdiction.

Authority. This Amendment is authorized by Ordinance No. 95048 passed and approved December 13, 2001.

Contract Amendment Documents. Terms and conditions for performance and payment of compensation for the additional work are set forth in the following contract documents, true and correct copies of which are each attached and fully incorporated herein verbatim for all purposes:

Subcontractor / subcontracts. Zephyr's modification to subcontracts for this project and / or change in subcontractors, if any, is subject to written approval and consent from the City's Environmental Services Department.

Work Start Date. Work shall begin within twenty four (24) hours following instruction from the Environmental Services Department to commence. Zephyr shall not commence work until receiving such instruction.
