### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This Ordinance will close, vacate and abandon an improved portion of Sharp Street Public Right of Way located between S. Laredo and Tunstall Streets within NCBs 919 and 920, as requested by the abutting property owner, MAPCO, INC., for the total consideration of \$14,546.00.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Petitioner is requesting to close, vacate and abandon an improved portion of Sharp Street located between S. Laredo and Tunstall Streets within NCBs 919 and 920, as shown on attached Exhibit "A". If approved, the petitioner intends to incorporate the proposed closure with its abutting properties and develop a multi-story office complex. Petitioner owns all of the properties abutting the proposed closure. This project is located within Council District 1.

### POLICY ANALYSIS

This action is consistent with City Ordinances regulating the closure, vacation and abandonment of Public Right of Way within the Corporate Limits of the City of San Antonio.

### FISCAL IMPACT

The City will collect \$14,546.00 as consideration for this closure, vacation and abandonment of Public Right of Way.

### COORDINATION

In compliance with City procedures, this request has been canvassed through interested City departments, public utilities and applicable agencies. A Canvassing Checklist and an executed Letter of Agreement, by which the petitioner agrees with all conditions imposed through this canvassing, are attached for review.

### **SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS**

The City of San Antonio's Planning Commission will consider this request at its regular meeting of 8/13/2003 and its finding will be presented to City Council on 8/21/2003.





#### **Political Contributions**

Indirect contributions by an entity include, but are not limited to, contributions made through the officers, owners, attorneys, or registered lobbyists of the entity.

Dear Mr. Padron:

With reference to the captioned project, please be advised that the City of San Antonio has now completed the canvassing process and will recommend approval of your request subject to the following conditions:

<u>PLANNING DEPARTMENT</u>: "In the event of any development on the vacated property, the petitioner must file a formal subdivision plat vacating and replatting the area as per Article IV Procedures, Division 4 Subdivisions of the Unified Code (UDC) for the City of San Antonio."

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT: "Retain as easement for surface drainage conveyance."

<u>DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT</u>: "The request to close, vacate and abandon improved Sharp Street is recommended for approval provided a cul-de-sac is provided at the most westerly portion of Tunstall Street. In addition, the section to be closed must be assembled and platted with the petitioner's property."

<u>CITY PUBLIC SERVICE</u>: "Must retain electric and gas easements for existing electric and gas facilities, or if feasible, remove/relocate facilities at owner's expense during development."

<u>SAN ANTONIO WATER SYSTEM</u>: "Provided any existing water and/or sewer easements must remain accessible for operational and maintenance purposes at all times."

### **DEPARTMENT OF ASSET MANAGEMENT:**

The closure, vacation and abandonment of this Public Right of Way will be authorized by a City Ordinance. Petitioner asserts that all evidence of ownership of all proposed to be closed, vacated and abandoned by the City of San Antonio is true and correct. Petitioner acknowledges that this property will be accepted in its "as is" condition. Petitioner agrees to reserve a perpetual easement for all existing overhead, surface or subsurface utilities within the Public Right of Way proposed to be closed, including but not limited to: electrical, water, sewer, telephone, cable, fiber optic conduit, etc. Petitioner agrees to allow perpetual access to any such utilities or may seek the relocation of a specific utility with express permission and coordination of the respective owner of the utility at the sole expense of the petitioner.

Petitioner agrees to pay a total closure fee of \$14,546.00 which includes the assessed value of the Public Right of Way and additional fees of \$144.00 for the posting of two (2) signs notifying the public of the proposed street closure and \$60.00 for the recording fees. This closure fee will be due and payable to the City of San Antonio prior to City Council consideration. If for some reason the closure is not approved by City Council, the closure and recording fees will be refunded to the petitioner, less the fee for the posting of notification signs.

This Letter of Agreement is being offered by City of San Antonio only to the petitioner named below and will expire (30) days after date of issuance unless a specific extension is requested by the petitioner and granted by the City.

If you concur with the above-mentioned conditions please countersign this letter in the space provided below and return to the undersigned. Upon receipt of this executed Letter of Agreement and the completed Discretionary Contracts Disclosure Statement we will continue processing your request we will continue processing your request.
