SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This Ordinance will authorize a License Agreement for a ten (10) year term between the City of San Antonio and AVANCE, a Texas Non-profit Corporation to use Public Right of Way on and over Medina and Houston Streets at the Heimann Building located at 118 N. Medina Street for the construction of two (2) balconies within New City Block 264 as part of the renovation of this historic facility, for the total consideration of \$3,754.00, which includes a 50% reduction of the license fee as provided by the Development Incentive Toolkit, passed and approved by City Council on May 29, 2003.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Petitioner is requesting a license to use Public Right of Way on and over Medina and Houston Streets at the Heimann Building located at 118 N. Medina Street for the construction of two (2) balconies within New City Block 264 as shown on attached Exhibit "A". Petitioner is proposing the renovation of this historic building which is in the vicinity of the Historic Cattleman's Square and will serve as the permanent National Headquarters for AVANCE Family Support and Education Programs. This project qualifies for a 50% reduction of the license fee under the City's Development Incentive Toolkit because it includes the renovation of a historic building for a corporation owned office development within a Federal Empowerment Zone. This project is located within Council District 5.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This action is consistent with the City Code and Ordinances, which require City Council approval for any private use of property owned or controlled by the City.

FISCAL IMPACT

The City will collect \$3,754.00 for this license to use Public Right of Way that includes a 50% reduction of the license fee per the City's Development Incentive Toolkit.

COORDINATION

In compliance with City procedures, this request has been canvassed through interested City departments, public utilities and applicable agencies. A Canvassing Checklist and an executed Letter of Agreement, by which the petitioner agrees with all conditions imposed through this canvassing, are attached for review. This request was also coordinated with the Department of Economic Development for the purpose of applying the Development Incentive Toolkit.

SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS

The City of San Antonio's Planning Commission will consider this request at its regular meeting of 8/13/03 and its finding will be presented to City Council on 8/21/03.





Dear Ms. Valencia:

With reference to the captioned project, please be advised that the City of San Antonio has now completed the canvassing process and will recommend approval of your request subject to the following condition:

<u>CITY PUBLIC SERVICE</u>: "City Public Service poles on Houston Street are in conflict with construction and need to be removed prior to construction."

Additionally, petitioner agrees to pay the total license fee of \$3,754.00 for a 10-year term, which includes \$40.00 for the recording fees. This fee is based on a 50% discount of \$7,508.00 due to the petitioner qualifying in accordance with the Development Incentive Toolkit, passed and approved on May 29, 2003. This license fee will be due and payable to the City of San Antonio prior to City Council consideration. If for some reason the license is not approved by City Council, the total license fee will be returned to the petitioner.

Also, a Certificate of Insurance must be provided to the City Clerk's Office by which the City of San Antonio is formally released from any and all liabilities, which may be incurred in connection with this request.

If you concur with the above-mentioned conditions, including the payment of the fee established for this encroachment, please countersign this letter in the space provided below and return to the undersigned. Upon receipt of this signed Letter of Agreement, the Certificate of Insurance and attached Discretionary Contracts Disclosure Statement will continue processing your request.
