# **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance authorizes the City Manager or her designee to accept a grant in the amount of \$50,000 from the National Endowment for the Arts for the production of the third annual International Accordion Festival (IAF 03); authorizes the City Manager or her designee to contract with the International Accordion Festival, a Texas Non-Profit organization, to produce the event; and provides for payment of \$50,000 to the International Accordion Festival for producing the event.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

# **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The International Accordion Festival will hold its third annual FREE festival in La Villita October 18 & 19, 2003. Over the past three (3) years, this unique event has developed a reputation for providing high quality entertainment and educational programming by presenting performances and workshops featuring diverse, accordion-based musical traditions of the world.

The Office of Cultural Affairs (OCA) has been an integral partner in the festival each year. In 2001 OCA received a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts that was subsequently passed through to Texas Folklife Resources (TFR), which is Austin based. This grant was matched by grants from corporate sponsors, the Texas Council for the Humanities, concession sales and in-kind services. TFR continued to produce the event in 2002 with funding which again came from the NEA, corporate sponsors, the Texas Council on the Humanities, concession sales and in-kind services. OCA helped promote the festival but was not involved in handling any of the funding.

This year, the original request for funding proposal was submitted to the NEA through TFR but awarded to OCA. All agencies involved agreed that this decision was critical to finally begin positioning IAF as a San Antonio organization, and to enhance local sponsorship. IAF has also moved forward with its incorporation as a Texas non-profit organization based in San Antonio to independently handle all fundraising beginning in 2005. The Texas Commission on the Arts, corporate sponsors, concession sales and in-kind services will provide matching funds.

# **POLICY ANALYSIS**

This ordinance is consistent with Council's direction to develop arts and cultural programs targeted toward visitors to San Antonio and the Office of Cultural Affairs' goal of developing cultural tourism programs as an economic generator.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no impact on the general fund. The grant from the National Endowment for the Arts requires a 1-1 match that will come from foundation grants, corporate sponsorships, concession sales and other fees associated with the festival and related activities, and in-kind percentages of management personnel supported by the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund.

# COORDINATION

The Office of Cultural Affairs has coordinated with Legal Department, Convention & Visitors Bureau, and Parks & Recreation in this project.

#### **SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS**

This event is unique in the nation and is quickly becoming one of the jewels of the fall arts season. Last year people traveled from as far away as Washington State and Washington DC specifically to attend the International Accordion Festival.
