SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$800 payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio for title fees in connection with the McCullough - UPRR to Basse project, a 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond project located in Council District 1.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

There are five parcels to acquire in this project. Advertisement is scheduled for December 2004 by the Texas Department of Transportation, with construction to begin in March 2005, and will be completed by September 2006. The scope of this project includes the reconstruction of the existing two lane roadway and adding a center turn lane (from 36 feet to 72 feet). The project will also include the construction of curbs, sidewalks, bicycle accommodations, and necessary drainage.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funded Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY03-FY08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$800 are available from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds and authorized payable to Lawyers Title of This item represents a portion of the total estimated City project cost of San Antonio. \$738,860.00.

COORDINATION

This ordinance was coordinated with the Finance Department, the Office of Management and Budget, the City Attorney's Office, and the Texas Department of Transportation.
