SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$1,400 from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds, payable to Dugger, Canaday, Grafe Incorporated for appraisal services in connection with the Nakoma - U.S. 281 to Warfield, an authorized 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond project, located in Council District 9.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

There are two parcels to be acquired in this two-parcel project. This project will be let for contract in December 2004 by the Texas Department of Transportation, start construction in March 2005, and be completed by November 2005. The scope of this project includes the widening of the existing two-lane roadway to four lanes with a channelized right turn lane at the intersection, (approximately 52 feet) with curbs, six-foot sidewalks against the curb, and necessary drainage.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funded Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY03-FY08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$1,400 are available from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds and authorized payable to Dugger, Canaday, Grafe, Incorporated. This item represents a portion of a total estimated City project cost of \$740,014.

COORDINATION

This ordinance was coordinated with the Finance Department, the Office of Management and Budget, the City Attorney's Office, and the Texas Department of Transportation.
