#### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This Ordinance approves appointments to the Alamo Workforce Development Board (AWDB) to fill vacancies in the higher education category and in the category of private sector small/for profit business. Representatives from the Committee of Six met on August 27, 2003 to interview and recommend applicants for this board. The Committee selected Dr. Bennie J. Wilson to serve in the higher education category and Denise L. Powers for the private sector small/for profit business category. Both appointments will fill un-expired three-year terms on the Alamo Workforce Development Board (AWDB).

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Vacancies on the Alamo Workforce Development Board (AWDB) are filled by the Chief Elected Officials (CEO's) of the Alamo region through their representatives on the Committee of Six. The Committee of Six considered three nominations for the category of private sector large/for profit business vacancy and three for the higher education category. Those considered included:

The Committee selected Denise L. Powers, Owner, Meeting Professionals of San Antonio to fill the business appointment. She was nominated by the Women's Chamber of Commerce. They also selected Dr. Bennie J. Wilson, Assistant Dean, College of Business, UTSA to fill the education vacancy. The Rural Area Judges, and Bexar County Commissioners Court as well as the San Antonio City Council must approve these appointments.

#### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

This ordinance is a continuation of current City policy authorizing the City Council to review and approve appointments to the AWDB through the Interlocal Agreement between the Chief Elected Officials and the Alamo Workforce Development Inc.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no direct fiscal implication from the approval of this nomination.

#### **COORDINATION**

This item has been coordinated with AWD, Bexar County, the Area Rural Judges, the City Attorney's Office, and was approved by the Committee of Six at their meeting on August 27, 2003.

#### **SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS**

There are thirteen board positions that expire December 31, 2003. Of those, nine members have expressed interest in being reappointed and are eligible to do so. Provisions of the City's Ethics Ordinance do not apply to these appointments.
