ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT WITH

HEALTHMASTER SERVICES TO CONCENTRA HEALTH SERVICES, INC.

### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance authorizes the assignment of the City alcohol and drug screening contract that is currently with Healthmaster Services to Concentra Health Services, Inc. The original contract began July 1, 2002. The contract amendment began July 1, 2003 and will continue through June 30, 2004. The contract has two subsequent one-year renewal options. The ordinance also approves payments to Concentra for services to be rendered under the contract.

Staff recommends approval.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Ordinance No. 95897, passed and approved on June 13, 2002, authorized the City Manager to execute a contract with Healthmaster Services to provide alcohol and drug screening services for prospective non-uniformed City employees and City employees operating commercial vehicles. This contract was achieved after a formal RFP process and yielded testing fees that were below those charged by the previous contractor. To "lock-in" this fee structure the City obtained options for three (3) one-year renewals at level rates.

During the first year of the contract Healthmaster Services performed satisfactorily and was subsequently provided a one-year renewal through Ordinance No. 97931 passed and approved on August 7, 2003. However, via a letter dated August 26, 2003 (See Attachment I), Healthmaster Services announced that it has merged with Concentra Health Services, Inc., a well-known national company that specializes in employee health services with over 200 service locations throughout the United States, five in San Antonio. The letter from Healthmaster requested that the City agree to assign the contract to Concentra. By assignment, the contract provisions and rates remain the same.

The City has contracted with Concentra in previous years for this service and has been satisfied with the work provided. Execution of the offer to accept assignment will allow the terms, conditions and fee structure of the current contract to continue with a proven company.

Approximately 3,500 pre-employment applicants are processed annually. In addition, the City anticipates 900 random, pre-employment, reasonable suspicion, post-accident, return-to-duty and follow-up urine drug

tests annually and 450 random, reasonable suspicion, post-accident, return-to-duty and follow-up alcohol breathalyzer tests annually.

### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

The purpose of these activities is to be in compliance with federal transportation and drug-free workplace guidelines. This ordinance follows past City policy in outsourcing specialized services to companies that can perform them more efficiently and effectively.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

This ordinance follows the routine business practice of accepting a contract assignment when the new contractor can and will provide the same product or service at the same price.

### **COORDINATION**

The Human Resources Department, the City Attorney's Office and the Office of Management and Budget, Risk Management Division, have reviewed the professional services agreement, "Second Year" renewal, and consent letter with Healthmaster Services. The Finance Department has been apprised of this action. The Economic Development Department also concurs.
