SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends a professional service contract, ratifies services and authorizes funds in the amount of \$4,647.97 to be made payable to S.M. Galindo Engineers, Inc., a MBE firm, for additional professional services in connection with Delgado – Navidad to Zarzamora, an authorized Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) project located in Council District 1. Of the \$4,647.97 total amount, \$4,136.75 will be funded by CDBG funds from the Construction Contingency Account, and \$511.22 will be funded by the San Antonio Water System (SAWS).

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance will amend the professional services agreement as part of the anticipated design implementation for this project, ratify services and authorize the payment of funds in the amount of \$4,647.97 to S.M. Galindo Engineers, Inc. of which \$4,136.75 will be transferred from the construction contingency account, and \$511.22 will be reimbursed by SAWS. This ordinance authorizes additional professional engineering services for the revision of driveway plats and Construction Phase services in connection with the Delgado – Navidad to Zarzamora project.

Project construction was completed in May of 2003 and included the reconstruction of Delgado Street to a 30-foot width with drainage improvements, new curbs, sidewalks, and driveway approaches as needed.

This professional service contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 79072 on November 10, 1993 and initially authorized \$30,000.00 for services related to this project. Subsequent Council action increased this contract amount to \$46,097.42. This ordinance will increase the total authorized for this agreement to \$50,234.17.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved CDBG funded Capital Improvement projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and not included in the FY 04-09 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$4,136.75 are available from the construction contingency account and funds in the amount of \$511.22 are available from SAWS and are authorized payable to S.M. Galindo Engineers Inc., Inc. for engineering expenses.

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget, the Finance Department, the Department of Housing and Community Development and the San Antonio Water System (SAWS).


