SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends a professional service contract in the amount of \$5,515.00 payable to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc., a non-MBE firm, for professional engineering services, in connection with the Hi Lions Drainage #80 Project, Phases III & V, an authorized 1987 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funded project located in City Council District 3.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance will authorize an amendment to the Professional Services Agreement as part of the anticipated design implementation for this project and provide additional compensation to Pape-Dawson, Inc. for professional engineering services involving the preparation of Plan of Record Tracings and the review of the Construction Contractor's final construction cost over-under tabulation.

This project provides for the reconstruction of streets in the area bounded by Clark, Vanderbilt, Amanda and Rigsby with Dasa Leo, Wendy and Shawn Marie as additive alternates to the project. This reconstruction includes 2-lane street sections, 4-foot sidewalks, curbs, driveway approaches and underground storm drainage and also provides for the replacement of gas, water and sanitary sewer mains and laterals.

This professional service contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 89461 on March 25, 1999 and initially authorized \$78,800.00 for services related to this project. Ordinance Number 91371, passed and approved on March 2, 2000 increased the contract amount to \$255,800.00. This Council action will increase the total authorized for this professional service contract to \$261,315.00.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 1987 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funded projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and not included in the FY 04-09 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$5,515.00 are available from 1987 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funds and are authorized payable to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc. for engineering expenses.

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.


