## **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance amends a professional service contract and authorizes funds in the amount of \$11,103.00 payable to Carter & Burgess, Inc., a non-MBE firm, for additional professional services in connection with the McCullough from Union Pacific Railroad Tracks to Basse project, an authorized 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond and Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) project located in Council District 1.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

This ordinance will amend the professional services agreement and authorize the payment of funds in the amount of \$11,103.00 to Carter & Burgess, Inc. for additional professional engineering services for the realignment of the storm sewer system in connection with the McCullough from Union Pacific Railroad Tracks to Basse Project. The determination to re-align the storm sewer system is the result of coordination between the City and City Public Service regarding the project's impact on existing CPS substations and underground duct banks. The realignment of the storm sewer system will prevent the anticipated 18 to 24 month delay that would result from the necessary utility planning, design and construction prior to the street and drainage project commencement.

Project construction is anticipated to begin in March 2005 and will include the reconstruction of the existing 2-land roadway and the addition of a center turn land with curbs, drainage improvements, sidewalks, bicycle accommodations and driveway approaches as needed. Project completion is anticipated in September 2006.

This professional service contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 91752 on May 11, 2000 and initially authorized \$174,090.00 for services related to this project. Subsequent Council action increased this contract amount to \$194,281.00. This ordinance will increase the total authorized for this agreement to \$205,384.00.

## **POLICY ANALYSIS**

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond and MPO projects.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and is included in the FY 04-09 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$11,103.00 are available from 1987 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funds and are authorized payable to Carter Burgess, Inc. for engineering expenses.

#### COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.


