SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$510.45 payable to Ticor Title Agency of San Antonio for title fees in connection with the Hi-Lions Drainage Project #80, Phases III & V, a 1987-1992 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond authorized project, located in Council District 3.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Acquisition of this property was necessary for construction of a drainage and sanitary sewer right of way. Construction on this project is complete. The scope of this project included the reconstruction of the streets and drainage in the area bounded by Clark, Vanderbilt, Amanda, and Rigsby. Dasa Leo, Wendy and Shawn Marie were an additive alternate to the project. Project included two-lane street sections, four-foot sidewalks, curbs, driveway approaches and underground storm drainage. Gas, water, and sanitary sewer mains and laterals were replaced. It also included four-foot sidewalks, curbs, driveway approaches, and underground storm drainage.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Payment of title fees on the acquisition of this property is necessary to complete this real estate transaction in this project.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and not included in the FY04-FY09 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$510.45 are available from 1987 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bonds and authorized payable to Ticor Title Agency of San Antonio.

COORDINATION

This ordinance was coordinated with the City Attorney's Office, the Finance Department, and the Office of Management and Budget.
