### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This Ordinance will close, vacate and abandon portions of North Las Moras Street and an intersecting 13 foot-wide alley Public Rights of Way located located between Morales and Perez Streets adjacent to NCB 2214, in Council District No. 1, for the expansion and redevelopment of the adjacent Margil Elementary School, as requested by San Antonio Independent School District, for the consideration of \$12,725.00.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Petitioner is requesting the closure, vacation and abandonment of portions of North Las Moras Street and an intersecting 13 foot-wide alley Public Rights of Way located between Morales and Perez Streets adjacent to NCB 2214 as shown on attached Exhibit "A." Petitioner would like to use the proposed closures for expansion of the adjacent Margil Elementary School Campus which would entail the construction of a new school building and an Early Childhood Development Facility with a separate playground area. Further, the petitioner maintains that the proposed closures will provide for a more safe and secure campus. All abutting property owners have signed a petition agreeing to the proposed closures.

### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

This action is consistent with City Ordinances regulating the closure, vacation and abandonment of Public Right of Way within the Corporate Limits of the City of San Antonio.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The City will collect \$12,725.00 as consideration for this closure, vacation and abandonment of Public Rights of Way.

### **COORDINATION**

In compliance with City procedures, this request has been canvassed through interested City departments, public utilities and applicable agencies. A Canvassing Checklist and an executed Letter of Agreement, by which the petitioner agrees with all conditions imposed through this canvassing, are attached for review.

### **SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS**

The City of San Antonio's Planning Commission will consider this request at its regular meeting of 2/25/2004 and its finding will be presented to City Council on 3/4/2004.



Dear Mr. Elhabr:

With reference to the captioned project, please be advised that the City of San Antonio has now completed the canvassing process and will recommend approval of your request subject to the following conditions:

### DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Approved provided that proposed closures are assembled and platted with the petitioners' properties.

### CITY PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD

Approved provided perpetual easements are reserved for all existing electrical and gas facilities and petitioners must allow access to such facilities for inspection.

### SAN ANTONIO WATER SYSTEM

Approved provided perpetual easements are reserved for all existing water and/or sewer facilities and petitioners must allow access to any such utilities for inspection, operational and maintenance purposes or may seek the relocation of the facilities with the express permission and coordination with the San Antonio Water System and at the sole expense of the petitioners.

### DEPARTMENT OF ASSET MANAGEMENT

- The closure, vacation and abandonment of these Public Rights of Way will be authorized by a City Ordinance.
- Petitioners assert that all evidence of ownership of all property abutting the Public Rights of Way proposed to be closed, vacated and abandoned by the City of San Antonio are true and correct.
- The petitioners acknowledges that this property will be accepted in its "as is" condition.

- Petitioners agrees to reserve a perpetual easement for all existing overhead, surface or subsurface utilities within the Public Rights of Way proposed to be closed. including but not limited to: electrical, water, sewer, telephone, cable, fiber optic conduit, etc. Petitioners agree to allow perpetual access to any such utilities or may seek the relocation of a specific utility with the express permission and coordination of the respective owner of the utility and at the sole expense of the petitioners.
- Petitioners agree to remit a closure fee of \$12,725.00, which includes the assessed value of \$12,546.00 for the Public Rights of Way, a fee of \$144.00 for posting of signs notifying the public of the proposed street closures and \$35.00 for recording documents. This closure fee will be due and payable to the City of San Antonio, and is to be submitted with this Letter of Agreement. If for some reason the closures are not approved by City Council, the closure fee will be refunded to the petitioners less the fee for posting of signs.

This Letter of Agreement is being offered by City of San Antonio only to the petitioner named above and will expire thirty (30) days after date of issuance unless a specific extension is requested by the petitioner and granted by the City.

If you concur with the above mentioned conditions, including the payment of the assessed closure fee, please countersign this letter in the spaces provided below and return to the undersigned. Upon receipt of this executed Letter of Agreement and the closure fee we will continue processing your request.
