SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends a professional service contract in the amount of \$24,766 payable to Brown Engineering Co., an SBE firm, for professional engineering services, and authorizes \$4,953.20 for additional design contingency for a total amount of \$29,719.20 in connection with the Cardiff Area Drainage Improvements, an authorized 2003-2007 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funded project located in Council District 2.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance authorizes the amount of \$24,766 payable to Brown Engineering Co. to provide engineering services for the referenced 2003-2007 bond drainage project and authorizes engineering contingency in the amount of \$4,953.20. The scope of services encompasses the effort required to:

- 1) verify existing site conditions;
- 2) breakout that portion of the storm drainage improvements located along Aransas Ave. and Honey Blvd. (needed to provide an outfall for the Honey Commerce to Aransas project) from the previously approved (1999) final plans from the Cardiff Aransas to Dead-end project;
- 3) update said plans to comply with the latest city requirements; and
- 4) prepare bid documents for the revised scope of the project.

Construction phase services are not included in this proposal. Brown Engineering Co. proposes to complete said design work within 45 calendar days from notice to proceed.

This project will provide for the construction of storm sewer outfall along Aransas Avenue from IH-10 to Honey Boulevard, including a 1 ½" street overlay. The project construction is anticipated to begin in November 2004 and be completed in March 2005.

This professional service contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 81037 on November 3, 1994 and initially authorized \$15,000 for services related to this project. Subsequent Council action increased this contract amount to \$57,817. This ordinance will increase the total authorized for this professional service contract to \$82,583.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 2003-2007 Drainage Improvement Bond and CDBG funded projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This ordinance is also a declaration of the City's official intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds derived from the sale of the City of San Antonio, General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds, Series 2003-2007 for any authorized expenditures from any lawfully available funds of the City.

The following appropriations are contingent upon the sale of the City of San Antonio, General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds, Series 2003-2007 for Cardiff Area Drainage Improvements.

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and not included in the FY 04-09 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$29,719.20 are available from 2003-2007 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funds and are authorized payable as follows:

- \$ 24,766.00 Payable to Brown Engineering Co. for engineering expenses
- \$ 4,953.20 Payable for engineering contingency

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.



Cardiff - Aransas to Dead-End

Dear Mr. Gutierrez:

Brown Engineering Company is pleased to present its proposal to provide additional professional engineering services for a revised final-phase submittal for the referenced street and drainage improvement project. This proposal was requested by Mr. Charles Bloom and is being presented as per the City of San Antonio's "Professional Services Agreement for Engineering Services," revised May 1991 (copy enclosed). The final design phase of this project was previously approved by Mr. James Bader on November 29, 1999 (copy enclosed), but was put on hold due to lack of funding.

The revised proposal covers the "additional" engineering services associated with preparing a set of plans, bid documents and cost estimates for the storm drainage improvements located within Aransas Ave. and Honey Blvd. We do not anticipate that the following items will be required, and any costs associated with these items are not included in this proposal.

- Redesign of the current plans as a result of new utility conflicts (if any), or new drainage criteria
- 2. ADA review and permitting
- 3. Landscape and sidewalk plan
- 4. Environmental Site Assessment (ESA)
- 5. Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA)
- 6. Revising and updating the remaining plans for street improvements into bid sets

The Construction Phase Services are not included in this proposal. We expect that these costs will be covered under the original contract based on the actual bid price.

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The following items cover "additional" engineering services required to verify that the existing site conditions are accurately reflected on the plans.
