SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends a professional service contract in the amount of \$63,416 payable to Bain Medina Bain, Inc. for professional engineering services and authorizes \$6,342 for engineering contingency, for a total amount of \$69,758, in connection with the Nacogdoches Road – IH 410 to Danbury project, an authorized 1999-2004 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond and Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) funded project located in Council District 10.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

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This project will provide for the reconstruction of the existing 4-lane roadway to 4-lanes with a concrete median and left-turn lanes, and will include a storm drainage system. The project construction is anticipated to begin in May of 2005 and be completed in May of 2006.

This ordinance will amend the professional services agreement and provide additional compensation to Bain Medina Bain, Inc. for professional engineering services to allow for changes in the project scope to include traffic considerations, drainage system revisions and adjustments in road width to accommodate the adjacent Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) project at the U.S. 281 and IH 410 Interchange. Additional services proposed include revisions to the schematics and to the drainage report to include an outfall line along Danbury and its design, additional signal design at Wagonwheel and an increase in fees for the geotechnical study and ADA review. The consultant's proposal is included herein as Attachment 2.

These authorized professional services will provide for the addition of median islands, the realignment of Wagonwheel and Blossom and the addition of a signal at the intersection of Nacogdoches and Blossom/Wagonwheel. The revision in the drainage outfall is necessary as the current Blossom/Wagonwheel storm sewer is not adequately sized to accommodate the full amount of run-off from Nacogdoches Road. The proposed outfall will carry the remaining flow from Nacogdoches to Danbury, east along Danbury to the end of the cul-de-sac, then along a proposed drainage easement to an existing concrete channel. The TxDOT project at U.S. 281 and IH 410 will increase the width of Nacogdoches Road under IH 410; therefore, this scope of this project must be revised adding width to Nacogdoches to match the TxDOT work.

This professional service contract was originally approved by City Ordinance No. 91751 on May 11, 2000 and initially authorized \$154,360 for schematics, drainage study and construction cost tabulation/estimates. This ordinance will increase the total authorized for this professional service contract to \$217,776 and will compensate the consultant for all engineering services through 100% Design Phase.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to participate in the development and construction of City selected and approved 1999-2004 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond projects and MPO projects, which are approved annually by Council.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY 04-09 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$69,758.00 are available from 1999-2004 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funds, and are authorized payable as follows:

\$63,416.00	payable to Bain Medina Bain, Inc.
\$ 6,342.00	payable for engineering contingency





Bain Medina Bain, Inc. (BMB) is pleased to submit this proposal to provide additional professional engineering services. The additional services include a number of revisions to the schematic, revising the drainage report to include an outfall line down Danbury, including the design of the outfall down Danbury, adding an additional signal design at Wagon Wheel, and an increase in fee for the geotechnical study and ADA review.

BMB was notified on January 28, 2000 that BMB was selected for this project. BMB was given a notice to proceed on June 6, 2000. BMB submitted a schematic, a drainage study, and a tabulation of expected construction costs in November 2000. BMB submitted a revised schematic based on comments in July 2001. Since the original submittal and revised submittal based on comment, BMB has submitted revised schematics and additional information more than 7 times.

The original estimate for the project by the CSA was \$1,754,880. BMB's original estimate after revisions based on comments was \$1,566,811.36. BMB's latest estimate is \$2,879,292. This estimate did include the drainage outfall but not the additional signal at Wagon Wheel.
