SUBJECT: Ordinance to Accept Solid Waste Grants

**DATE:** May 6, 2004

#### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance authorizes the City Manager or her designee to accept two (2) Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), Regional Solid Waste Pass-Through Grants, totaling \$246,207.50 from the Alamo Area Council of Governments (AACOG) for FY 2004. This ordinance also authorizes acceptance of any amended allocations of FY 2004 grant monies that may become available.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Since 1996, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has provided statewide grants to area Councils of Governments for distribution to municipal and local agencies. These funds are generated by local fees imposed by the State on volumes of disposed municipal solid waste. This expense is reflected in private and public fees charged by area landfills for municipal solid waste disposal services. Thereafter, the TCEQ allocates funding to the state's 24 Councils of Government. AACOG administers the pass-through grants for this region. For FY 2004, \$567,000.00 is available for grant applications from the AACOG region.

The two (2) grants awarded to the City of San Antonio Environmental Services Department are described as follows:

#### Recycling and Green Waste Education Program Phase II - \$128,907.50

In 2003, the Environmental Services Department received grant funding to promote and enhance community outreach for the city's curbside recycling program. Funds were used to purchase billboard advertising, production and purchase of radio spots, and for the design and creation of "Binnie", the department's recycling mascot. This 2004 grant award will provide funds to continue promotion of the City's recycling programs including curbside collection and

yard waste composting. Residents will be targeted in a variety of ways, including bilingual media and a "mobile recycling program" for use with children's education programs.

#### Citizen Collection Center - \$117,300.00

Funding will be used for enhancements to the City's brush/bulky item collection center adjacent to Camargo Park, to include design and construction of concrete ramps to facilitate citizen unloading. Currently, citizens drive to the drop off location and materials are lifted up and out of vehicles, then lifted up into roll-off containers. The construction of concrete ramps will allow for unloading materials directly from the vehicle into the roll-off containers since the vehicles will be at a higher elevation than the roll-off containers. This will significantly improve safety at this site as well. This site is open to the public during quarterly Free Disposal events and improves the operational efficiency of the brush and bulky item collection program.

#### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

Approval of this ordinance is consistent with City Council's policy to apply for and accept state and federal grants to support environmental protection programming efforts. All grant-financed activities are intended to carry out requirements of the Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act.

Resolution number 2004-05-05 was approved on February 5, 2004 and authorized the submission of applications for these solid waste pass-through grants.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The total amount of \$246,207.50 is to be allocated in the Environmental Services Fund. The Finance Department will assign project numbers for each grant.

#### **SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS**

Of the available FY 2004 funding available, San Antonio will receive approximately 48%. The following table describes the AACOG distribution of the funds.

A RESOLUTION 2004-05-05

AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OR HER DESIGNEE TO SUBMIT FOUR (4) OR MORE GRANT APPLICATIONS, FOR AN APPROXIMATE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$474,908.00, TO THE ALAMO AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2004 REGIONAL SOLID WASTE PASS-THROUGH GRANT FUNDS FROM THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY TO SUPPORT ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMMING EFFORTS RELATED TO RECYCLING, SOLID WASTE STREAM REDUCTION, AND MUNICIPAL ENFORCEMENT OF ANTI-DUMPING LAWS.

WHEREAS, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) provides statewide grants to area Councils of Governments for distribution to municipal and local agencies; and

WHEREAS, the City, along with the County and various Independent School Districts compete for these funds on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, this resolution authorizes staff to submit four applications to the Alamo Area Council of Governments (AACOG) for TCEQ FY 2004 Regional Solid Waste Pass-Through Grants, totaling approximately \$474,908.00 to recover money already collected in the community through state "tipping" fees imposed by law; and

WHEREAS, said funds will be used to support local environmental programs that are related to recycling, solid waste stream reduction, and municipal enforcement of laws related to illegal dumping; and

WHEREAS, this resolution also authorizes staff to apply for any other sums and programs for which the City may qualify under TCEQ's allocation formula, recognizing that this formula is subject to change, NOW THEREFORE;

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or her designee is hereby authorized to submit four (4) or more grant applications, for an approximate total amount of \$474,908.00, to the Alamo Area Council of Governments for Fiscal Year 2004 Regional Solid Waste Pass-Through Grant Funds, a vailable from the T exas Commission on Environmental Quality, to support environmental programming efforts related to recycling, solid waste stream reduction, and municipal enforcement of anti-dumping laws. These grant funds represent apportionment by the State of money collected in the form of State-wide tipping fees collected for municipal and other solid waste management activities, funds to be returned to the communities that generated the fees. Staff is further authorized to make additional applications for any future sums and / or programs that may become available during the funding period at hand.

**SECTION 2.** If the City of S an Antonio is a warded grant funding for AACOG FY 2004 Regional Solid Waste Pass-Through Grants from the TCEQ, future City Council action will be required to accept the grants and allocate funds to specific projects.

**SECTION 3.** This resolution shall take effect on February 15, 2004.
