### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance authorizes the City Manager to accept an award for the fourth year of a four year approved grant project in the amount of \$750,000.00 from the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) for the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (SAMHD) to continue the Healthy Start Initiative project to reduce the incidence of infant mortality and low birth weight in Bexar County for the period June 1, 2004 through May 31, 2005, establish the project fund, adopt the project budget, approve the personnel complement, and authorize payments for contractual services.

Staff recommends approval.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The San Antonio Healthy Start Initiative brings together community leaders to identify and address issues associated with perinatal health disparities. In addition, the project increases public awareness of the problem through community health education, and provides extensive outreach, recruitment, case management and health education interventions to women and families within a specific target community in San Antonio. In order to promote longer interconceptional periods and prevent relapses of risk behaviors, project services are planned for mother and infant through the infant's second year of life.

The goals of San Antonio's Healthy Start project are to:

1. Reduce the overall infant mortality rate within the target community by implementing community-based initiatives that build on current resources to improve perinatal health, with services delivered in a culturally and linguistically sensitive manner.

- 2. Enhance the community's perinatal service system by establishing a consortium of lay advisors and health care providers for the purpose of addressing disparities that affect perinatal health.
- 3. Increase the proportion of pregnant women who receive prenatal care in the first trimester to 85%. (Baseline: 1,783 of 2,213 pregnant women, or 81% received care during the first trimester: Source: City of San Antonio Vital Statistics, 1998-2000)
- 4. Decrease the number of post neonatal deaths within the targeted community from an average of 8.6% per 1,000 live births to the national average of 2.3 per 1,000 live births.
- 5. Decrease the proportion of infants born within the targeted community weighing less than 2500 grams from 8.4% to the national average of 7.6%.
- 6. Decrease the proportion of teens 19 years of age or younger giving birth within the targeted community from 20% to 16%.

The objectives for the Healthy Start project were chosen based on the needs of the targeted community, the availability of baseline data, and the capacity of community organizations to affect perinatal health behavior change. The project objectives support several Texas Department of Health strategic performance measures including: reduction in teen births, early prenatal care, and children fully immunized by age two, as well as related objectives of the national program Healthy People 2010.

To accomplish these goals and objectives, SAMHD's Healthy Start project is incorporating the proven strategies of outreach and recruitment, case management and health education. This fourth year grant will allow SAMHD to continue to consolidate and augment current population-based programs related to prenatal and infant health into a more coordinated and efficient initiative tied closely with Healthy Start. Additionally, the grant supports better cooperation and linkages with other maternal and child health providers in the community to improve patient access and decrease barriers to health care. This grant will also support funding for the HRSA required independent program evaluation, outreach services in the target area, evaluation of the current database, software consultation, and data validation. The personnel complement will consist of thirteen (13) personnel positions to administer and implement this project, a decrease of one Special Project Coordinator position from the previous year's budget that is currently vacant.

#### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

Passage of this ordinance will continue the long-standing practice of utilizing Federal and State aid to support the local public health programs of the City.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

HRSA will provide the Healthy Start Initiative budget with a grant award of \$750,000.00 to continue the fourth year of the project. This ordinance will place no demand on the City General Fund.

### **COORDINATION**

The City Attorney's Office and the Human Resources Department, Risk Management Division have reviewed and approved the HRSA Notice of Grant Award. The Finance Department has approved the proposed project budget.

#### **SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS**

Although the Notice of Grant Award reflects an issue date of June 30, 2004, the hardcopy award notice was not received at SAMHD until July 13, 2004.

Provisions of the Ethics Ordinance do not apply.
