SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance amends the professional services agreement in the amount of \$25,067 for additional professional engineering services, payable to Bury + Partners-SA, Inc., and authorizes \$2,506.70 for additional engineering contingency, for a total amount of \$27,573.70, in connection with the Thousand Oaks Intersections, an authorized 1999-2004 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond and Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) project located in Council Districts 9 and 10.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance will amend the professional services agreement and authorize funds in the amount of \$25,067 payable to Bury + Partners-SA, Inc. for field investigation, survey work and plan modifications to comply with the cross-slope requirements mandated by a recent ruling of the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) and specified in the Americans with Disabilities Act. In addition, this amendment includes modifications to the Traffic Control Plan (TCP) and revisions to plans, quantities and cost estimates for the purpose of shortening the overall construction time and satisfying the requirements of the American with Disabilities Act.

This professional services agreement was approved by City Ordinance Number 88171 on July 30, 1998, and initially authorized \$90,400 for engineering services in connection with this project. Subsequently, Ordinance Number 94379, passes and approved on August 23, 2001, Ordinance Number 96820, passed and approved on December 12, 2002, Ordinance Number 97542 passed and approved on May 1, 2003, and Ordinance Number 98250 passed and approved on October 2, 2003 have increased the total authorized amount of this professional services agreement to \$129,231.83, and authorized additional services including the development of a Water Pollution Abatement Plan (WPAP), field work, design services, modifications to plans, and property line staking for utility adjustments. This ordinance will increase the total authorized for this professional services agreement to \$154,298.83.

Project construction is anticipated to begin in March of 2005 and be completed in November of 2005.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to participate in the development and construction of City selected and approved MPO projects, which are approved annually by City Council.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure and included in the FY04-09 Capital Improvement Budget. Funds in the amount of \$27,573.70 are available from 1994-1999 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bond funds and are authorized payable as follows:


