# **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance authorizes the City Manager to accept a grant award totaling \$95,000.00 from the Cancer Therapy and Research Center (CTRC) to renew support for the ongoing Breast Cancer Screening Program in the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District from October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005. In addition, this ordinance establishes a fund, adopts the program budget, approves the personnel complement, and authorizes payments for contractual services.

Staff recommends approval.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The SAMHD operates a breast health program with components that include clinical breast examinations, training for women to do monthly self-breast examinations, free mammograms for uninsured low-income women 40 years old or older, and nurse case management for women with abnormal mammogram findings. This program is partially supported through a grant from CTRC, a local, non-profit corporation working to eradicate cancer as a life-threatening disease by advancing research, education, screening and treatment. CTRC has now offered a grant award totaling \$95,000.00 to continue financial support of this ongoing SAMHD program (See Attachment II). This grant will augment funds that are available for the breast health program received from the Texas Department of Health (TDH).

Through CTRC funding, SAMHD will provide free mammograms and diagnostic follow-up for approximately 350 uninsured low-income women. SAMHD handles all screening mammograms, diagnostic medical services and physician consultations through off-site professional contracts on a fee-for-service basis.

The personnel complement of this program remains at one (1) full-time Accountant II position (See Attachment I). This person processes medical claims in a timely manner and assures the accuracy of charges to the different grants supporting the SAMHD Breast Health Care Program. The Accountant II position will determine patient eligibility, process approximately 5,000 medical claims annually, and

submit quarterly financial reports for each of the three supporters of the breast health program. In addition, this grant supports authorized medical services and facilities on a fee-for-service basis to provide breast screening and diagnosis for patients referred in connection with the Breast Cancer Screening Program

## **POLICY ANALYSIS**

Acceptance of this grant award follows the City policy of utilizing Federal, State and other aid to support local public health programs.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

This ordinance provides \$96,000.00 (\$95,000.00 funding in this grant renewal and \$1,000.00 authorized carry-over from last year's grant) to renew the ongoing Breast Health Screening Program in the SAMHD for the period October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005. Of this funding, fee-for-service breast health contracts totaling \$71,790.00 are supported.

Acceptance of this grant award will place no demand on the City's General Fund.



To continue our on-going partnership, and to confirm your offer for continued support, SAMHD's understanding is that Cancer Therapy and Research Center will financially support the following outlined activities for 2004-2005:

Screening Mammography for 350 women at \$82.77 each	\$28,969.50
Diagnostic mammography for women presenting with breast problems 46 women at \$232.75 each (Unilateral, Bilateral Dx Mmgs & Ultrasounds)	\$10,706.50
Additional non-invasive diagnostic mammography 46 women at \$213.35 each (Consultation with breast specialists)	\$9,814.10
Invasive Diagnostic mammography 12 women at \$1,625.83 each (FNA, Biopsies, Clip, Anesthesia, Pathology, etc.)	\$19,509.90
0.6 FTE for Scheduling/Accounting/Billing for procedures	\$26,000.00
Total support for October 1, 2004 - September 30,2005	\$95,000.00

The intent of support is to provide screening mammograms to uninsured low-income women over the age of 40. 1) For women who need diagnostic mammograms and follow-up procedures UHS CareLink Program must first assessed for eligibility. If the client does not qualify for CareLink this grant will provide follow-up testing. 2) Women seen in SAMHD Family Planning Clinics with abnormal CBE can be appointed for diagnostic mammogram only. If further studies are needed, approval must be obtained through CTRC.

Again, we look forward to our continued partnership in the fight against breast cancer.
