SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

This ordinance accepts the proposal and awards a professional service contract in the amount of \$107,150.00 payable to Garcia & Wright Consulting Engineers, Inc., a MBE, and \$1,000.00 for advertising expenses, and for engineering services, authorizes an additional \$10,715.00 for design contingency expenses, for an overall total amount of \$118,865.00 in connection with the Elson and Inez - North San Joaquin to NW 34th Street project, an authorized Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funded project located in City Council District 5.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance authorizes compensation to Garcia & Wright Consulting Engineers, Inc., for engineering services to include design, plan preparation and bid documents, construction phase services and additional services to include Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) review and inspection, Traffic Control Plan (TCP) preparation, tree survey/protection/mitigation permit and landscaping services, record drawings and Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SW3P) as shown in the Proposal included herein as Attachment 2.

This project will include the reconstruction of Elson and Inez – North San Joaquin to NW 34th street to include curbs, driveways, 4 foot sidewalks, and necessary drainage. Design is anticipated to be complete by May of 2005. This project is currently funded for design only, but is awaiting additional funding through the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) 108 Loan Program.

This firm was selected following the City's release of a Request for Qualifications to which eleven (11) firms responded. The Public Works Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Selection Committee met and discussed the statements of qualifications, as well as their evaluations for each of the submitting firms. After careful consideration, the Committee selected Garcia and Wright Consulting Engineers, Inc., which was one of two firms ranked fourth. The Committee did not consider the first, second, third or other fourth ranked firm, because of their significant workloads with the City or the status of their current projects. Garcia and Wright Consulting have only one (1) project with the City in the amount of \$103,377.00. The Statement of Interest Review Summaries are included herein as Attachment 3. This project will be completed jointly by SAWS and the City.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and is included in the FY 05-10 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$118,865.00, are available from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and are authorized payable as follows:

\$107,150.00	payable to Garcia & Wright Engineers, Inc.
\$ 10,715.00	payable for design contingency expenses
\$ 1,000.00	payable for advertising expenses

COORDINATION


