SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$1,100 payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio as escrow agent for Servando Cordova and Irma Yolanda Cordova, for Fee Simple Title to one parcel of land (\$750), and Title Fees (\$350); authorizing funds in the amount of \$100 for a Right of Entry Fee payable to Servando Cordova and Irma Yolanda Cordova; authorizing funds in the amount of \$800 payable to Eckmann Groll Incorporated for appraisal services; for a total ordinance amount of \$2,000, in connection with the Rosabell Street -Culebra to Inez project, an authorized 2003-2007 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond funded project located in Council District 5.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project provides for the reconstruction of the existing street, adding curbs and sidewalks. This project is funded through construction and is currently under final design. Construction is scheduled for September 2005, with completion anticipated in August 2006.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and is included in the FY05-FY10 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$2,000 are available from 2003-2007 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds and authorized payable as follows:
